




Millions of persons, Civilian noninstitutional population, 16 years and older



Labor force participation rates for men and women have converged








Workers over 55 increase share of the labor force






Numeric change in labor force by age, projected 2006-16



Percent change in labor force by age, projected 2006-16








Percent change, projected 2006-16



Whites remain the largest group of workers






Labor force growth by ethnic origin











Average annual rate of change



Percent of nominal GDP











Goods-producing and service-providing industries by share of total employment and output








Nominal output by industry sector






Real output growth by industry sector






Wage and salary jobs by industry sector








Wage and salary growth by industry sector, projected 2006-16





Numeric employment by major occupational group, 2006




Percent change in employment by major occupational group, projected 2006-16






Numeric change in employment by major occupational group, projected 2006-16






Job openings by major occupational group, projected 2006-16






Percent growth in employment, projected 2006-16






Numeric growth in employment, projected 2006-16





Job openings due to growth and net replacement needs, projected 2006-16






Decline in employment by occupation, projected 2006-16




Percent change in employment by education or training category, projected 2006-16






Numeric change in employment by education or training category, projected 2006-16
