

## TPB Technical Committee June 5 Meeting Highlights

June 11, 2015

The Technical Committee met on June 5 at the Ronald F. Kirby Training Center at COG. The following items were reviewed for inclusion on the TPB agenda for June 17:

- TPB agenda Item 7

Staff from the Federal Transit Agency briefed the committee on the draft Transportation Planning Certification Review of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process for the Washington, DC-VA-MD Transportation Management Area. This review is conducted every four years. The draft report certifies that the TPB's planning process meets federal requirements. The report may not be finalized in time for the TPB meeting, but if it is ready, the committee recommends the TPB receive a briefing on it.

- TPB agenda Item 8

TPB staff provided a briefing on the COG State of the Region Infrastructure Report. This report represents the culmination to the COG's Board focus on Infrastructure in 2014. Committee members said the report effectively highlighted the increased requirements for infrastructure maintenance funding in the future. The committee recommended that the TPB receive a briefing on this report.

- TPB agenda Item 9

TPB staff reported on the development of regional list of unfunded transportation projects. The committee reviewed the draft list and discussed ways in which the list might be used for regional planning and analysis. TPB staff reported that the Steering Committee would be asked to provide guidance on the potential applications of the list. The committee recommended that the TPB receive a briefing on this work.

- TPB agenda Item 10

Staff from the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority briefed the committee on the responsibilities and current planning activities of the NVRTA, focusing on recent programming of new revenues. The committee recommended that the TPB receive a briefing on this work.

The following items were presented for information and discussion:

- TPB staff updated the committee on the Activities of the Transportation Sector Group of the COG Multi-Sector Working Group (MSWG) to Examine Greenhouse Gas Reductions. The next meeting of the MSWG is on June 18.
- TPB staff updated the Committee on the latest developments regarding US DOT regulations on performance measures under MAP-21.
- TPB staff updated the committee on the results of the Spring 2014 Regional HOV Study. Travel time and vehicle occupancy count data were collected last spring and these data have now been processed and analyzed.
