Technical Committees

- The board was updated on the Rail-Volution conference set to take place in Washington, DC on October 16-19, 2011. The conference will include sessions, workshops, and charrettes that relate to the movement's mission of using transit to develop livable communities that are healthy, economically vibrant, socially equitable, and environmentally sustainable.
- The board was presented a status report on the study of public attitudes toward road-use pricing in the Metropolitan Washington Region. From October 2011 to January 2012, the study will use a series of deliberative forums at locations throughout the region to assess public attitudes toward different pricing options such as variably priced lanes and system wide vehicle based pricing systems.
