HOWARD COUNTY, MD RECYCLING STREAM AUDITS:
EXPERIENCE & OBSERVATIONS



Goals:

- Determine the composition of the recycling stream
- Determine what areas for improvement exist
 - Develop outreach material with new messaging

The Process: set up



- Determine a schedule, rotate through routes and County staff
- 26 sorts completed
 - 15 residential routes
 - 1 FE route, 1 cart route & Residents' Convenience Center
- Informed County Collection staff, did not tell haulers

The Process – sorting




- Truck arrives at MRF
- Scalehouse directs the truck where to unload
- Sample taken from middle of load (avg 345lbs)
- Sorted by material category:
 - OCC
 - Mixed Paper
 - Plastics #1, #2 (natural & colored),
 #'s 3-7 and bulky/rigid
 - Aluminum
 - Steel & tin
 - Scrap metal
 - Glass
 - Residue
 - Bagged material weighed then sorted
- Weighed sorted material
 - Handheld scale
- Tracked the data

The Results!



- Paper and Cardboard 63%
- Plastics 10%
- Metals: 3%
- Glass 12.5%
- Residue: 11%
- Bagged: 14.5%
