

SALTING SMART

THE 3 PRO TIPS FOR USING ROAD SALT EFFECTIVELY

1. Shovel first



Clear pavement and driveways **before** snow has the chance to turn to ice.

2. Use just the right amount



A little salt goes a long way, and extra salt does **not** equal extra melting. Just one 12oz coffee mug holds the perfect amount for 10 sidewalk squares or a 20ft driveway.

3. Spread evenly



Make sure the salt granules are at least 1–2 inches away from each other and clean up spills.

Winter Salt Training Program

- Audiences
 - Winter maintenance professionals*
 - Property managers*
 - General public, local officials, etc.
- Hybrid program for maintenance professionals and managers
- Doing a module approach
 - Professionals and managers will take a test for certification*
 - General public modules will have free access



Winter Salt Training Program Timeline

- MDE is in process with ICPRB to create a manual and test for the certification
- The manual will be converted to a hybrid platform
 - Timeline: late summer/ early fall
 - Module based different groups will have specific combinations of modules
- MDE is interested in having a pilot group, who will "beta" test the training and provide feedback



Outreach

- Intern creating new posters, flyers, and outreach packets for public and private entities outreach
- New website updates to promote the program
- Once training is up and running a specific outreach for training materials

ATTACK THE *** SNOW LIKE A PRO!

SHOVEL EARLY, SHOVEL WELL

Removing snow before ice has the chance to form is the best way to stay on top of winter maintenance.





A LITTLE GOES A LONG WAY

In order for salt to be effective as a deicer, its important to measure out the right amount (no more, no less) for the surface you need to cover.

SPREAD EVENLY

Avoid clumps of salt. Use a handheld spreader or shaker in order to achieve an even spread where the salt granules are at least 1-2 inches away from each other.
