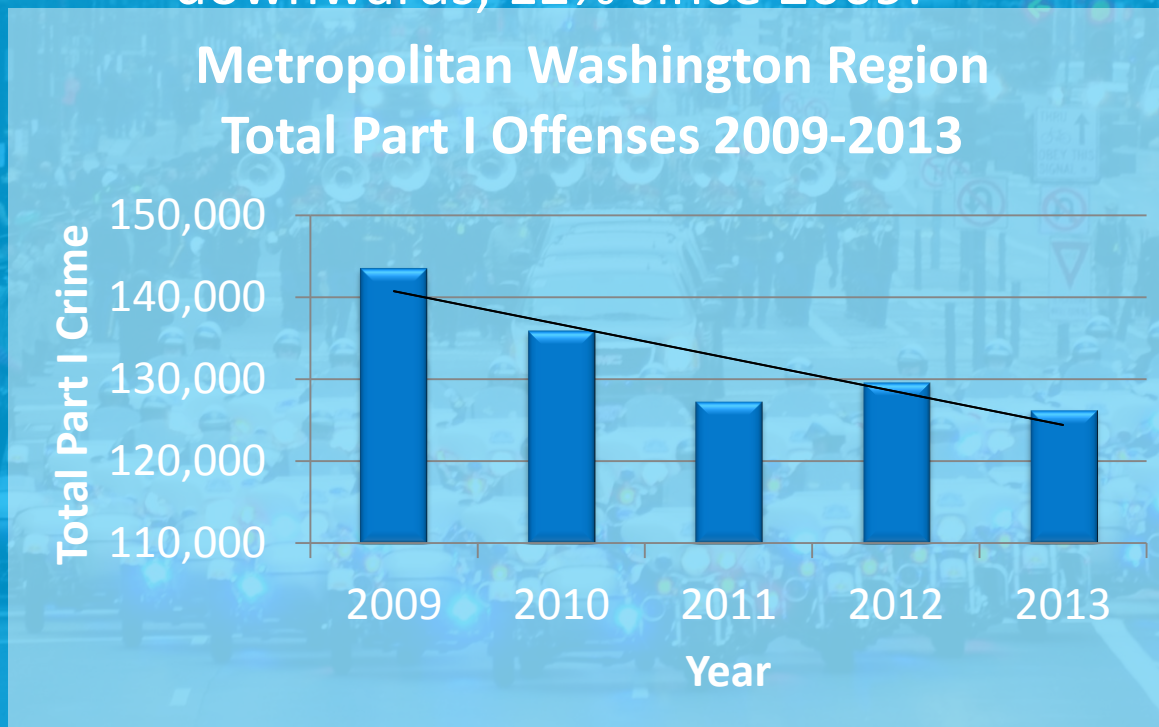

Good news!

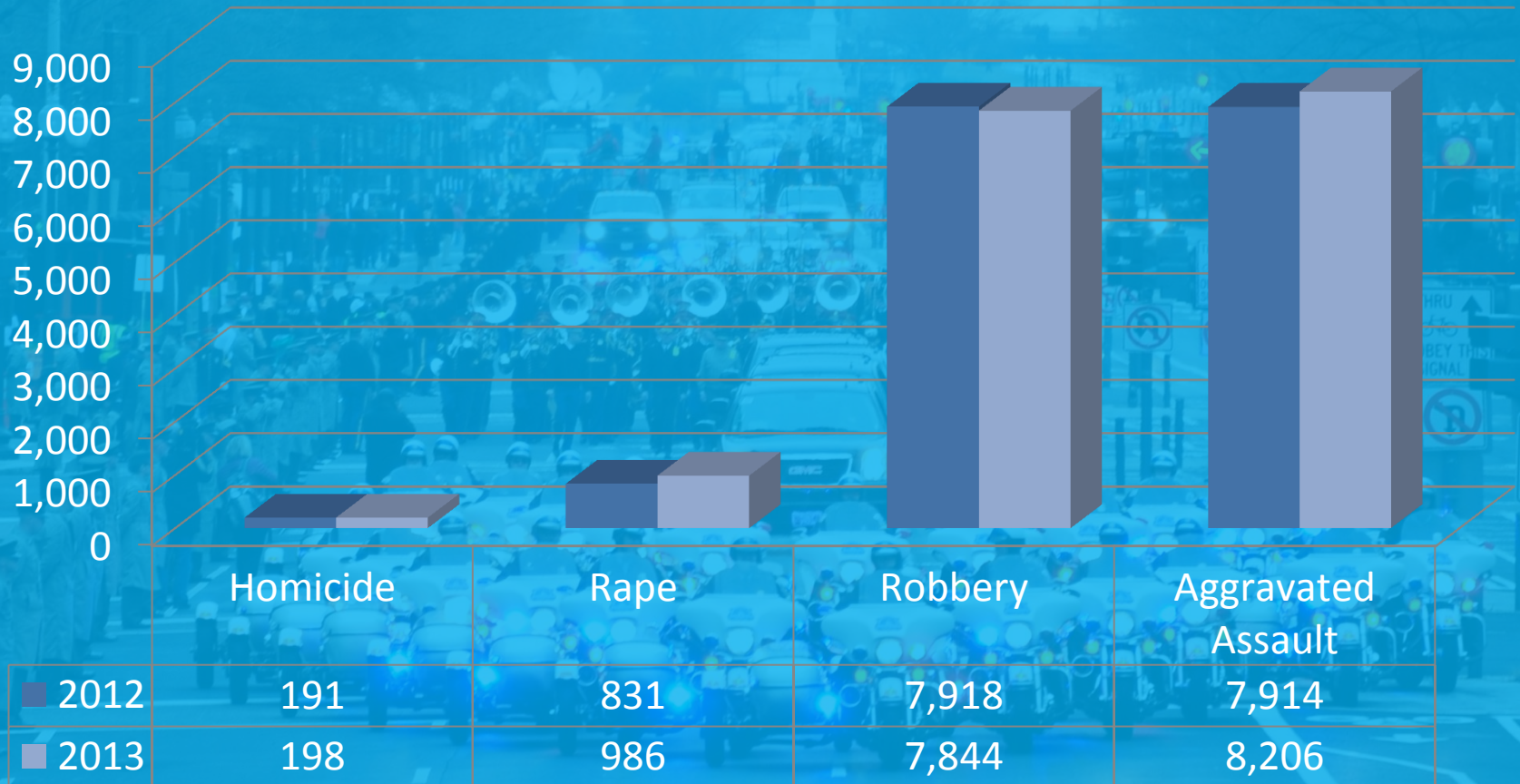
Total Part I Crime decreased 2.6% from 2012 to 2013 (129,666 v. 126,323).

Multi-year (2009-2013) Part I crime continues to trend downwards, 12% since 2009.

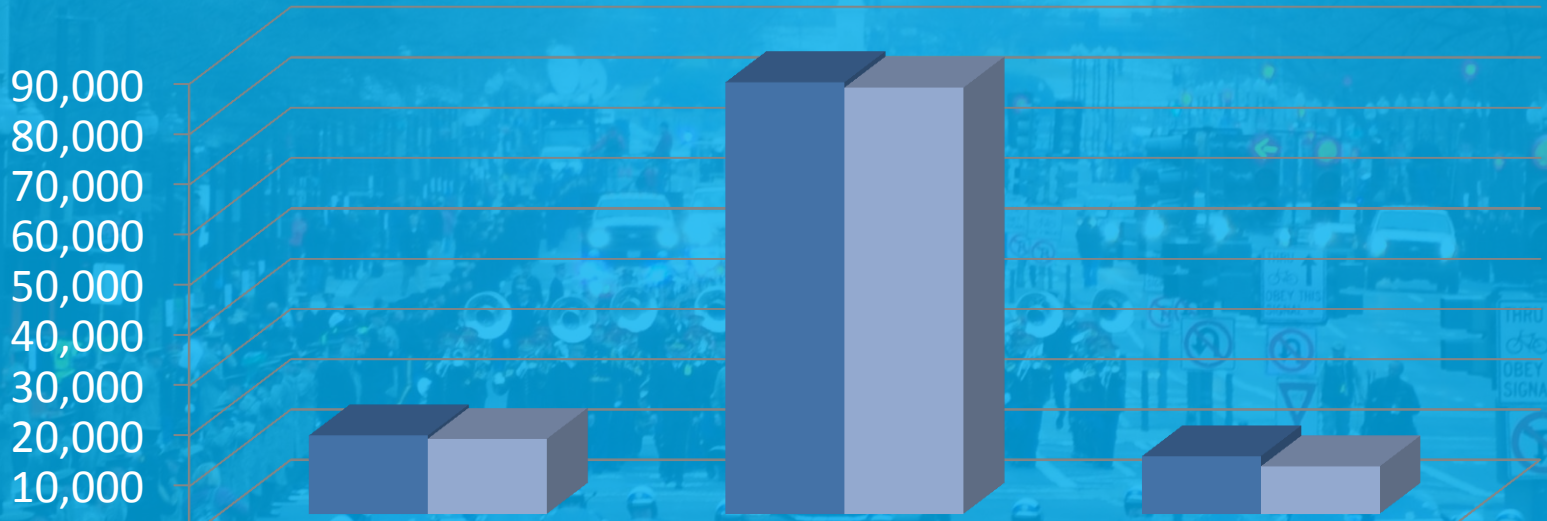


Note: Part I offenses are defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation as crimes against person (homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) and crimes against property (burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft).

Metropolitan Washington Region Violent Crime, 2012 v 2013

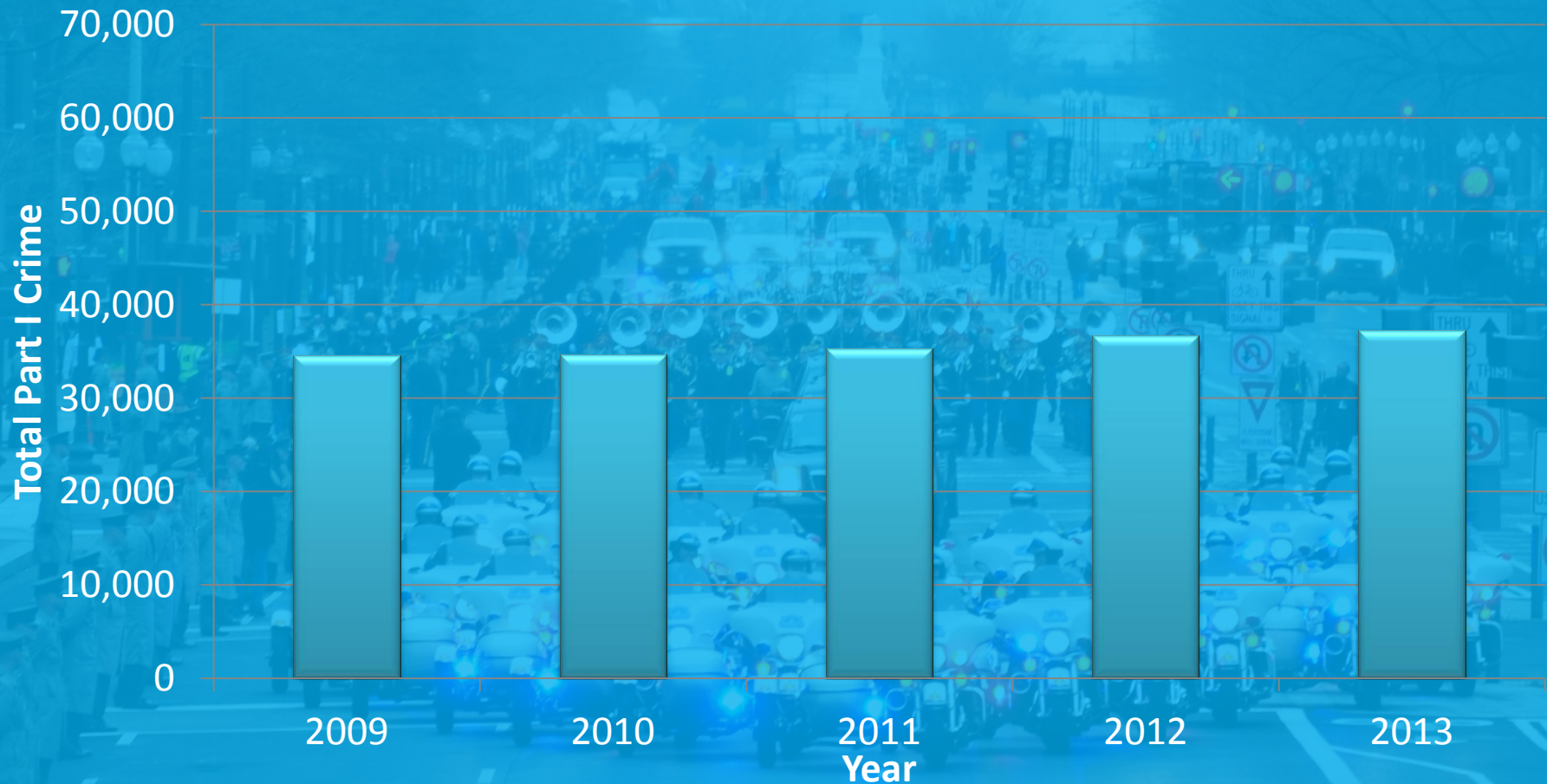


Metropolitan Washington Region Property Crime, 2012 v 2013

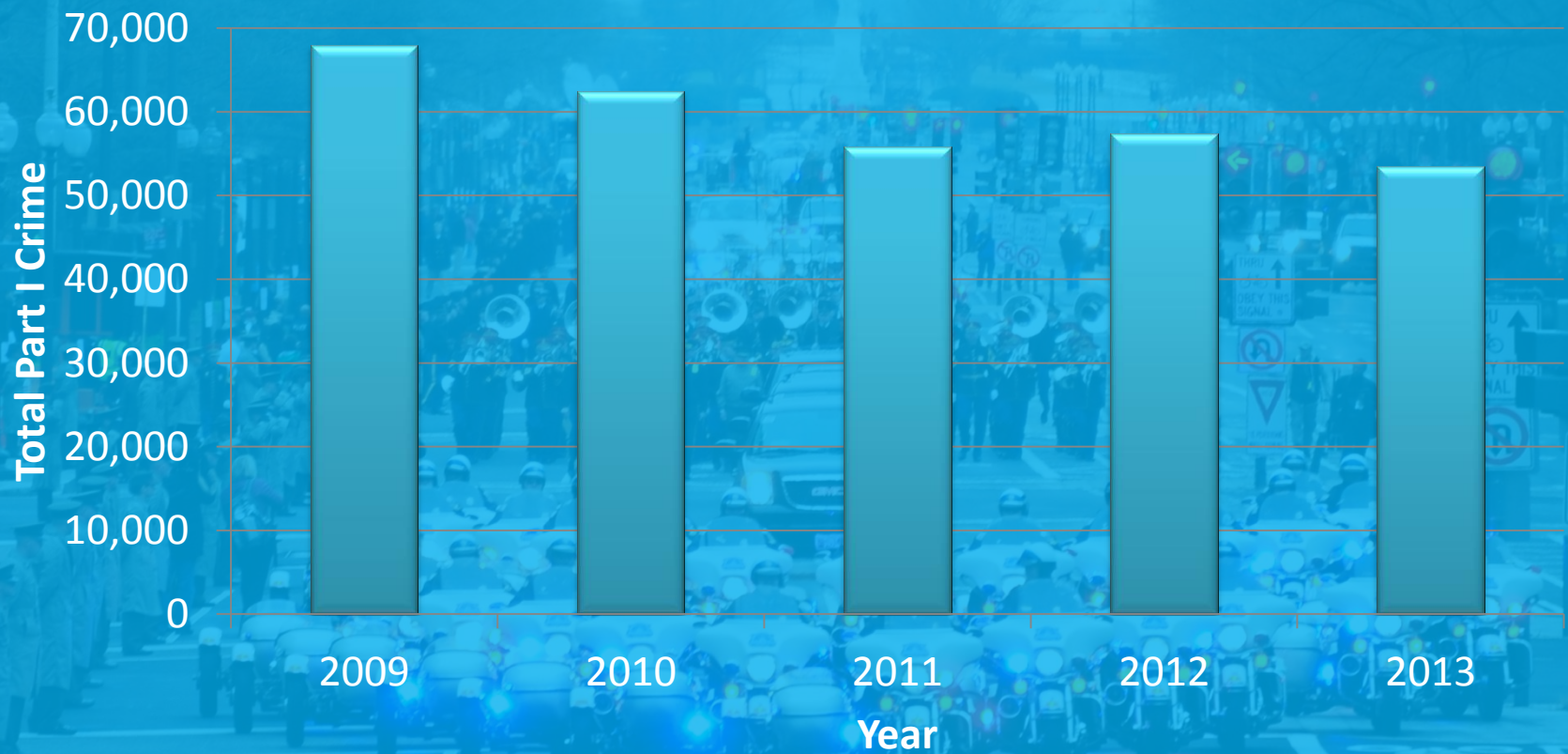

District of Columbia Part I Crime Trends, 2009-2013



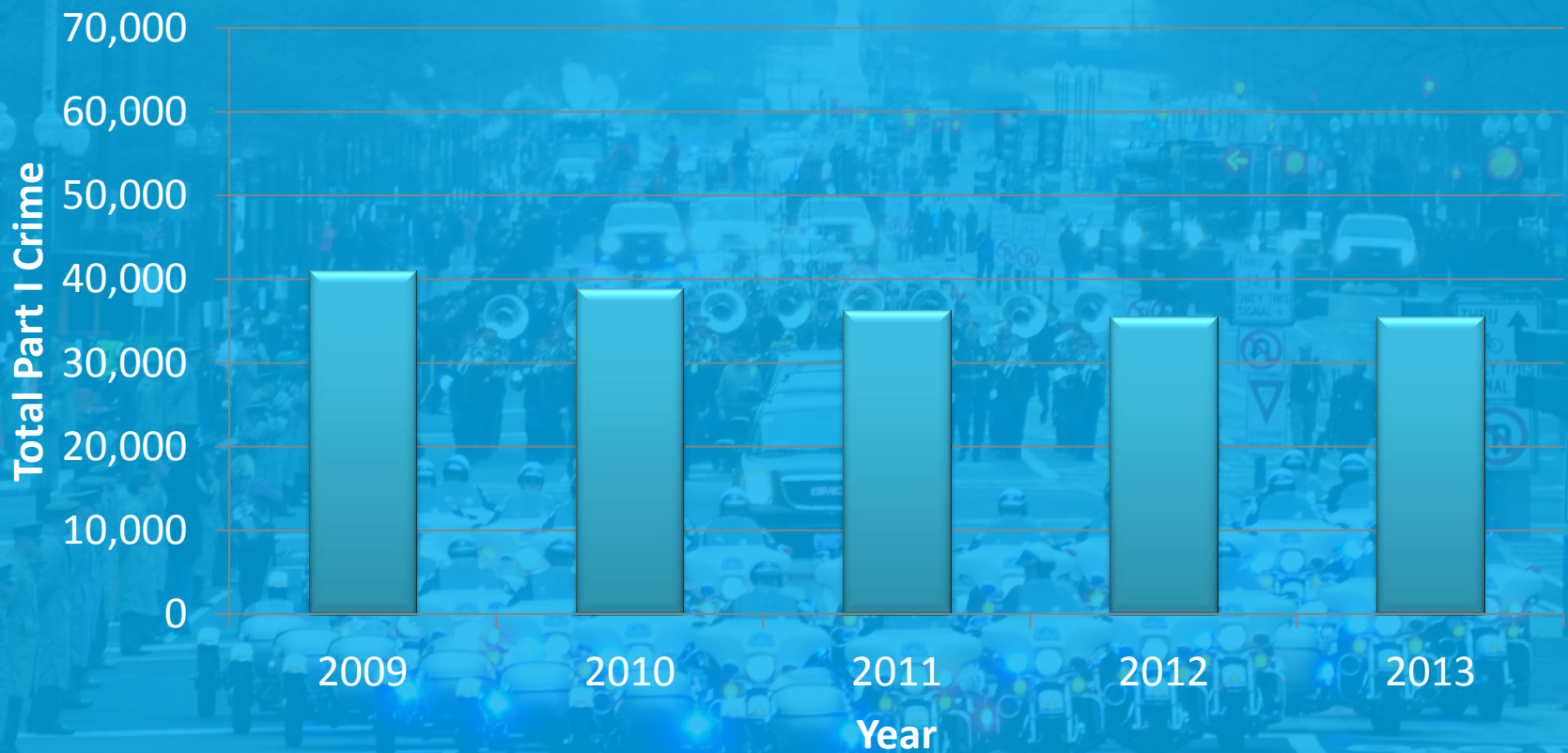
Maryland Part I Crime Trends, 2009-2013

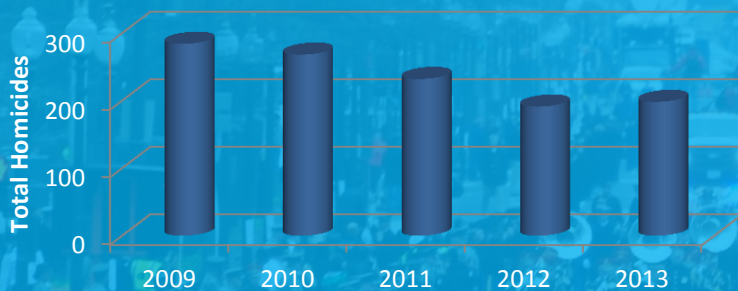

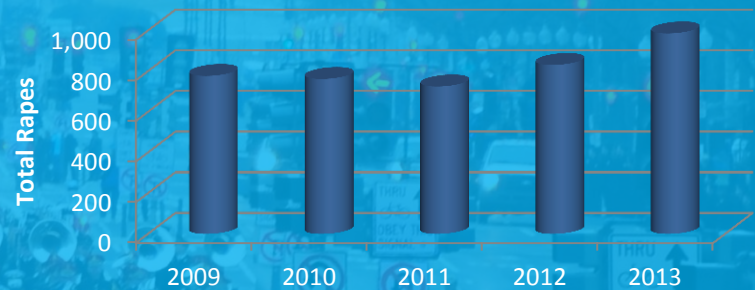

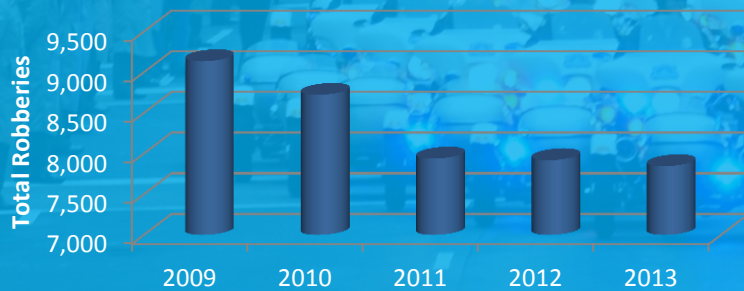
Homicide, 2009-2013



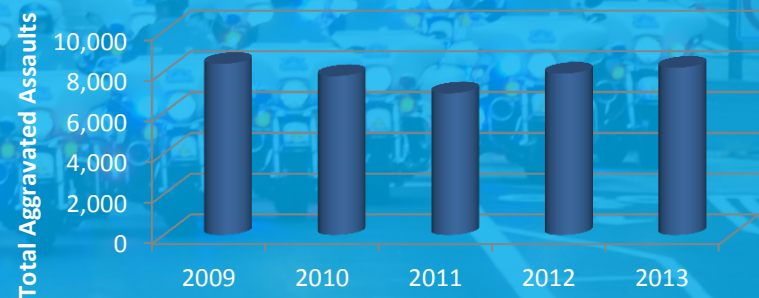
Rape, 2009-2013



Robbery, 2009-2013

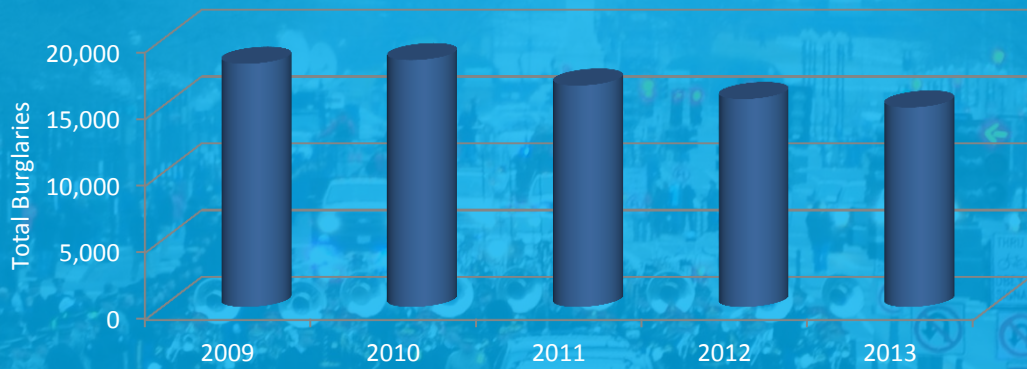


Aggravated Assault, 2009-2013

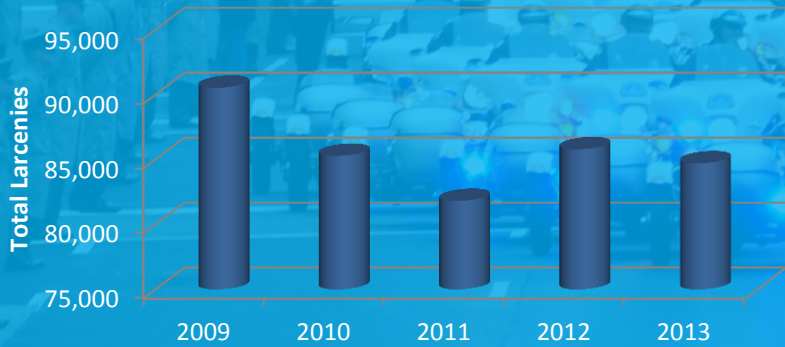


Metropolitan Washington Region Property Crime Trends

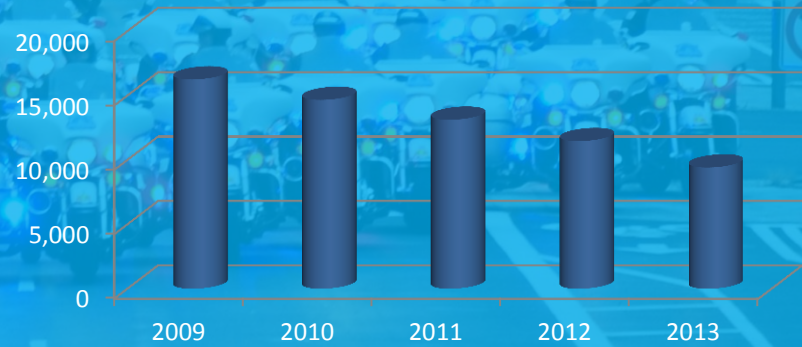
Burglary, 2009-2013



Larceny, 2009-2013

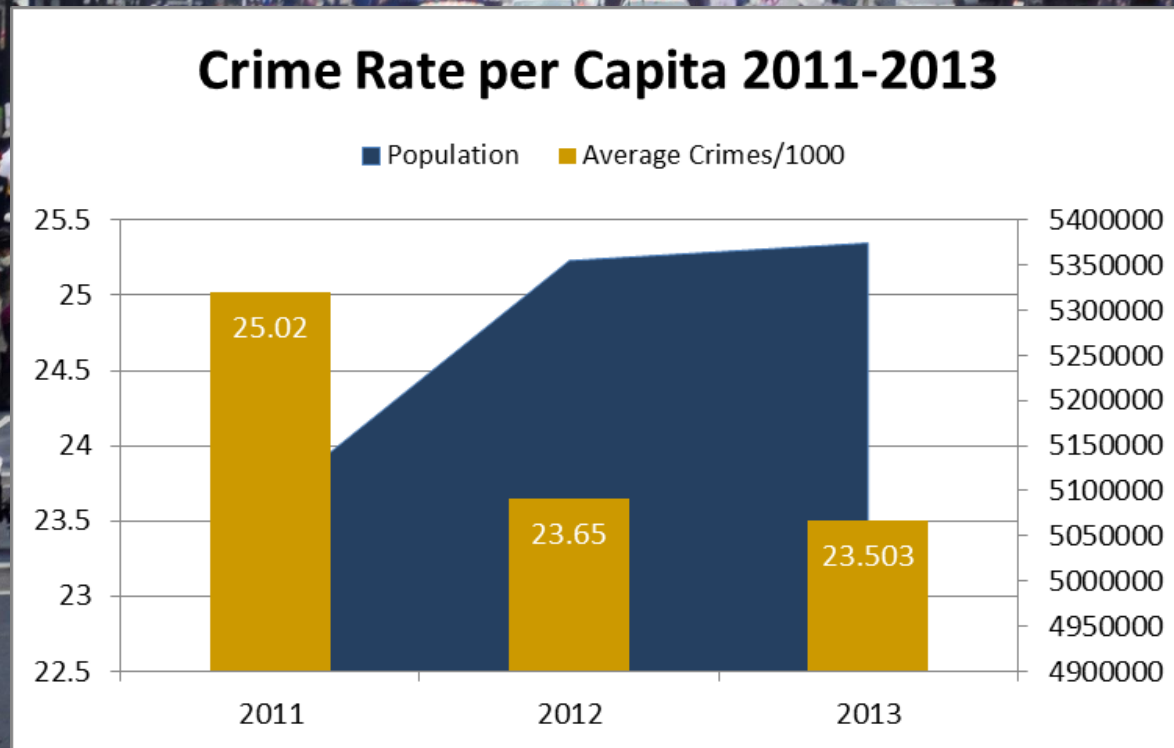


Motor Vehicle Theft, 2009-2013
