


Local Employment Dynamics (LED)

- Partnership between Census Bureau (LEHD) and State agencies
- Access to administrative records
 - Unemployment Insurance (UI) Wage Records
 - Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW)
- Combine with other data sources
 - Office of Personnel Management
 - Census Numident
 - Decennial and ACS
 - Business Register
- Frame of Jobs, Firms, and Workers

LEHD Data Products

- Quarterly Workforce Indicators (QWI)
 - 30 job-based indicators
 - State, county, metropolitan/micropolitan areas
 - Age, ownership, race, ethnicity, education, industry, firm age, firm size breaks
- LEHD Origin-Destination Employment Statistics (LODES)
 - Home-Work relationships
 - Census blocks based
 - Age, earnings, industry, race, ethnicity, education breaks
- Job-to-Job Flows (in development)
- AWI (in development)
