# WATER RESOURCES GENERAL

## <u>Climate Change – Water Sector</u>

The *Climate Adaptation Water Sector Meeting* took place on September 8, 2011 (after the WRTC meeting) to address climate issues related specifically to water resource issues. Since then the contractor, SRA International, has been preparing a draft climate adaptation guidebook for the local governments in the metropolitan Washington region based on stakeholders' comments. The draft guidebook is expected to be ready in December 2011, and will be distributed to all stakeholders. Meanwhile, COG staff is preparing various tables to present available baseline data and projected temperature and precipitation estimates for the metropolitan Washington area, noting sources, assumptions, and uncertainties. It is intended that such data could potentially be utilized by local governments and utilizes as input in their planning assumption when addressing climate change impacts. These data tables will be sent to the WRTC members for their review and input.

## **LEGISLATIVE UPDATES**

### Highlights of Preliminary Legislative Investigations Include:

### **Maryland**

Expect legislation on proposals to increase current Bay Restoration Fund and possibly Bay Trust Fund to close gap in funding for ENR upgrades and potentially to provide cost share funding for stormwater retrofits. Expect return of legislation on requiring local government to establish a stormwater utility.

### <u>Virginia</u>

Expect legislation to add funds to the WQIF to make up for ENR shortfalls and potentially provide funds for stormwater. Expect legislation to revise the state's Nutrient Credit Exchange Program to allow expanded trading opportunities among wastewater, stormwater, agricultural and septic sectors.
