Update on the Chesapeake Bay Program's 2030 Projections

On April 25, the Greater Washington 2050 Initiative held its third work session in COG's Board of Directors Room. Chair Sharon Bulova (Vice Chair, Fairfax County Board of Supervisors) introduced the new members of the coalition and reviewed the major outcomes from the March meeting. Ron Kirby (COG/DTP staff) reviewed the results of the original five alternative land use and transportation scenarios and the development of two new scenarios. ### Proposed Approach for Developing "Version 1" of the CLRP Aspirations and the "What Would It Take?" Scenarios

In April, the PDTAC received a briefing on the activities of the TPB Scenario Study Task Force. The TPB discussed the development of two new transportation and land use scenarios to be analyzed in FY 2009. The first of the two scenario study activities is the development of the CLRP Aspirations Scenario, which draws from the strategies explored in previously studied scenarios to develop a scenario that represents realistic yet ambitious levels of transportation investment and accompanying land use stewardship. The "What Would It Take" Scenario will begin with the performance objective of reducing regional carbon dioxide emissions and will determine the scale and mixture of interventions that might achieve this objective. Mr. Kirby will present a proposed approach for developing "Version 1" of the scenarios, and seek comment and recommendations from Committee members.
