This is also the location through which applicants can access the GRT IJ Submissions Technical User's Guide, which includes instructions on how to log into the GRT and complete the IJ.

Please allow enough time before and no later than 11:59 p.m. EDT, April 19, 2010 to complete the IJ in the GRT and submit the required application materials using www.grants.gov.

The National Capital Region (NCR) strategic plan has numerous initiatives relating to incident response and public safety preparedness - all of these are contingent on first responders being able to do their jobs with a reasonable assurance of personal safety. The NCR needs to be prepared to deal with catastrophic events that may include chemical, biological, radiological or nuclear (CBRN) elements, which means that first responders must have access to appropriate protective equipment. Initiative 4.3.3 is to develop and implement regional standards for equipment interoperability, and this investment will continue the NCR's efforts to supply standard articles of personal protective equipment to first responders. This Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Investment addresses a regional need to properly equip and protect first responders during a chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) or weapons of mass destruction (WMD) incident, by funding the following four (4) initiatives:

- Level B PPE Replacement: this initiative replaces Level B PPE acquired with 2003 and 2004 UASI grant funds and set to expire in the coming year; this gear is essential to ensuring the continued protection of first responders.
- Extended CBRN PPE Operations for Law Enforcement: this initiative ensures that law
 enforcement agencies throughout the National Capital Region (NCR) have access to the
 necessary equipment during chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear (CBRN)
 incidents by funding a regional cache of PPE gear and storing it in a secure facility.
- Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Hydrostatic Cylinder Testing: this initiative
 funds the federally-mandated testing of the air cylinders purchased under the 2005 UASI
 grant; without the hydrostatic testing, the cylinders could not legally nor safely be used for
 compressed breathing air.
- 4. Structural PPE Replacement: this initiative builds the capability for firefighters to respond to a CBRNE/WMD incident, by purchasing a second set of PPE gear; such structural gear, when contaminated, is rendered unusable, and a second set is therefore necessary to prevent any lapse in service during an emergency.
