At the April 18, 2007 meeting, the Board approved the first Coordinated Human Services Transportation Plan for the National Capital Region, which includes the competitive selection process to be used to solicit project applications and select projects for funding under these programs. The first project solicitation for JARC and New Freedom funds was conducted from May 1 through June 30. In July and August, a selection committee comprised of members from the TPB Human Service Transportation Coordination Task Force reviewed the project applications and recommended that five projects be presented to the TPB for funding approval. The Board will be briefed on the solicitation and selection process and asked to approve the five projects for funding.
