Recent Awards, Honors & Accomplishments

- Loudoun Moves Forward with Electric Vehicle Charging Stations Project: The Board of Supervisors has set a fee policy for the new stations. Details
- New Energy & Environmental Program and Policy Administrator: Loudoun County has hired Alan Brewer as the new Energy and Environmental Program and Policy Administrator. More
- LED Lights Installed in Purcellville: Energy-efficient LED lights have been installed on Main Street in Purcellville with money from Loudoun County's federal stimulus funds. Details
- Cascades Chosen for WE CAN Pilot Program The Loudoun County community of Cascades is participating in the pilot phase of WE CAN- a residential energy efficiency campaign run by the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments. Cascades residents are competing against the Brookland neighborhood in D.C. and Greenbelt, Maryland to reduce their energy use with the help of a website containing tips and an online energy monitoring tool. - Virginia Municipal League "Go Green Government Challenge" Loudoun County received the Platinum award in the 2010 challenge, the third year in a row that Loudoun has won the top award. Details
- Virginia Governor's Energy Conference Loudoun County was asked to make a presentation on the Loudoun County Energy Strategy at the "Virginia: Energy Capital of the East Coast The Governor's Conference on Energy," October 12–14, 2010, in
- Milestone Achievement Award In September 2010, Loudoun County received a prestigious Milestone Achievement Award from ICLEI-Local Governments for Sustainability (ICLEI), a membership association of local governments committed to advancing climate protection and sustainable development.
- "Green Community Challenge" In August 2010, Loudoun County was selected as

one of four communities to participate in the pilot "Green Community Challenge," a friendly competition among Virginia communities to develop specific environmental policies and implement practical actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and address local sustainability.

- Energy Retro-Fits Offered: Through the federal Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant program, Loudoun County can provide home energy retro-fit grants to low-and moderate-income homeowners in Loudoun County. Loudoun County can provide additional home improvements through the Loudoun County Home Improvement Program.
- U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Recognition In June 2010, Loudoun was recognized for being "a prime example of promoting energy efficiency and stabilizing communities for the homeless in addition to assisting lowand very low-income residents by using stimulus funds for solar panels at the county's homeless shelter and renovating units at Windy Hill to make them more energy efficient.

Loudoun Receives National Recognition for Energy Strategy

The National Association of Counties has recognized Loudoun County for its Energy Strategy, a comprehensive, 30-year-roadmap of energy strategies for the Loudoun County government and community, which was adopted by the Board of Supervisors in December 2009. The adopted Energy Strategy and appendices are online:

Loudoun Energy Updates

- Loudoun County has reduced its annual kilowatt usage by an estimated 433,210 kilowatts in county facilities, with an estimated savings of more than \$112,000. Details are online here.
- In 2009, the Board of Supervisors approved a series of energy conservation measures at several Loudoun County facilities, including the Claude Moore Recreation Center, the Department of Information Technology, the Fire & Rescue Training Building, the Loudoun County Government Center, the Shenandoah Building and the Courts Complex, to include the Judicial Center and historic Courthouse. The measures to be implemented include installing high-efficiency lighting; reprogramming controls to limit electric demand and more efficiently deliver outside air to heating and cooling systems; improving weatherization; and conserving water.

Ad Hoc Committee on Energy Efficiency becomes Standing Committee

In January 2009, the Board of Supervisors created the Committee on Energy & Environment as a new standing committee, replacing the Ad Hoc Committee on Energy Efficiency formed a year earlier.

ENERGY STAR Partnership

The county is part of the ENERGY STAR partnership, a joint program of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Energy designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

This partnership is part of the county's commitment to protect the environment through energy efficiency. In partnership with ENERGY STAR, the county will:

 Measure and track the energy performance of county facilities where possible by using tools such as those offered through ENERGY STAR;

- Develop and implement a plan consistent with the ENERGY STAR Energy Management Guidelines to achieve energy savings;
- Help spread the word about the importance of energy efficiency to the Loudoun County government workforce and citizens; and
- Support the ENERGY STAR Challenge, a national call-to-action to help improve the energy efficiency of America's commercial and industrial buildings by 10 percent or

In addition, Loudoun County will receive recognition on the ENERGY STAR web site as a partner and also as a supporter of the ENERGY STAR Challenge. To be eligible for additional recognition, the county will share its progress and milestone achievements with the program.

State & Regional Efforts

Loudoun County exceeded the energy savings goal set for the "Cool Capital Challenge," a Washington D.C. area regional competition. Loudoun also won a first place award in the Virginia Municipal League's "Go Green Virginia:" Green Government Challenge.
