2022 State of the Commute Survey Overview of Method

Method

- Entirely Internet method more representative data than telephone, at a much lower cost.
- Similar to 2019 SOC method
- Respondents randomly-selected using Address-Based Sample (ABS) method that selects postal mail addresses ensures greatest population coverage
- Selected households receive postcard survey invitation, with Internet URL to the survey website
- Each postcard will include 2 passcodes, allowing 2 employed adult residents to take the survey
- Estimate 2.0% response rate, so will need to send 400,000 postcards
- Financial incentive (gift card drawing) for respondents who complete the survey
- Spanish language option offered for both Internet and telephone <1% of past survey SOC interviews were conducted in Spanish

Sample

- Survey 8,000 randomly-selected employed residents across the region
- Jurisdiction level sample targets similar to 2019 SOC
- Confidence level for region of **95% ± 1.1%** (8,000)
- Internet survey conducted in 2 Waves; Wave 1 assumes equal response rates across the region; Wave 2 will be used to distribute higher share of postcards to low response areas
- Expand jurisdiction-level data for accurate representation of workers within the region; weight data to adjust for age/ethnicity under/over-counts in raw sample

- 2019 average length was approximately 18.0 minutes; assume same length for 2022
