#### **Description:**

The MWAQC Technical Advisory Committee recommends that MWAQC and the States request EPA to issue a Clean Data Determination for fine particles (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) for the Washington metropolitan area. EPA's Clean Data Policy can be requested because the Washington region's monitor data has been in compliance with the 1997 federal health standards for fine particles since 2005.

Staff will discuss the advantages of the Clean Data Policy for the Washington region. The main benefit to the region would be to provide time to resolve air quality plan (SIP) issues resulting from the D.C. Circuit Court's decision in July to vacate EPA's Clean Air Interstate Rule (CAIR), a rule that contributed to 28 states and the District's ability to meet the PM2.5 standard by the 2009 deadline.
