A. CEEPC Survey Results

COGs CEEPC policy committee recently collected regional climate/energy environment information through a survey to inform its goals and targets for 2013-2016 in the Climate & Energy Action Plan. The survey was sent to schools, water utilities, and local governments in the region in early 2012. Seven water agencies responded.

Ms. Campbell will highlight water utility energy-saving and sustainable activities and practices reported in the survey.

B. ENVISION Sustainable Infrastructure Rating Tool

Ms. Campbell will describe the key features of the Envision sustainable infrastructure rating tool developed by the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure and compare to LEED, which applies to buildings and small neighborhoods.

Feedback: WRTC members will be invited to share additional details about current or planned water sector climate and energy initiatives in their organization that the survey might not have captured, and to provide feedback on the potential usefulness of this rating tool to COG's members.
