

Freddie Mac: We Make Home Possible

- Chartered by Congress in 1970
- **Mission:** to stabilize nation's mortgage markets and expand opportunities for homeownership and affordable rental housing
 - **□** 41 million homebuyers
 - **□** 2 million renters
 - ☐ Financed homes for more than

 5.5 million families in 2003
 - More than half low- and moderate-income families






- The Freddie Mac Foundation and Freddie Mac's corporate giving programs work together to:

- □ Earned recognition as #1 corporate giver in our region

- Freddie Mac's corporate giving and employee volunteerism efforts encompass:

- In 2003, Freddie Mac awarded 375 corporate contributions, totaling \$26 million primarily in the Washington region










Freddie Mac's Hoops for the Homeless

Magic Johnson will again lead the event, now benefiting seven charities.








Freddie Mac Foundation Focus Areas

- Opening doors of hope and opportunity for children, youth and their families through outcomes-based funding
 - **□** Strengthening Families
 - Preventing child abuse and neglect and promoting early childhood development
 - **☐** Foster Care and Adoption
 - Finding loving, permanent homes for foster children
 - **☐** Youth Development
 - Helping youth achieve academically and grow into caring, successful adults
- **\$25.7 million** invested in the communities we serve in 2003
 - □ Approximately 70 percent -- or \$17.7 million -- in the Washington area




Strengthening Families

Youth Development



 - ☐ Presented the Foster Parent Appreciation Gala, and much more...






Working Together for Washington's Foster Children
