#### **BACKGROUND and EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Bike to Work Day has been held annually in the Washington metropolitan region for over a decade and was originally started by the Washington Area Bicyclist Association with a main rallying point or pit stop in downtown DC. In September 2000, The National Capital Region Transportation Board (TPB's) Commuter Connections program, housed at the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments, partnered with WABA to form a regional Bike to Work Day Steering Committee to examine the feasibility of adding additional Bike to Work Day pit stops or rallying points throughout the region in 2001, thus creating a larger awareness of using cycling to work as a viable commuting alternative. Since that first involvement with Bike to Work Day in 2001, annual registrations for the event have grown expondentially over the years. In 2020, the event was canceled due to the COVID pandemic, reinstated in 2021, and is gradually looking to rebound to pre-COVID levels.

Several bicycles were raffled off and all the registrants who attended received a free BTWD 2023 T-shirt.

Bicyclists enjoyed free T-shirts, snacks, participated in prize drawings, and heard live bands as well as music and listened and talked to elected officials.

The success of the marketing promotion campaign relied upon targeting of employer and commuter audiences, identification of cost-effective media, crafting key messages, and procuring giveaway items such as t-shirts designed to attract commuters to try bicycling to work.

The Steering Committee's resources for Bike to Work Day 2023, included:

- Web site designed and maintained by Commuter Connections.
- > Posters and rack cards developed and printed by Commuter Connections.
- Promoting the event through WABA's membership.
- > A comprehensive campaign produced and placed by Commuter Connections.
- Outreach to employers through a direct mail and email marketing campaign by Commuter Connections.
- ➤ An article in the Commuter Connections employer newsletter.
- Local marketing efforts by the various pit stop managers.
- An e-mail to previous year's participants by Commuter Connections.
- Banners designed and printed by Commuter Connections.
- A public affairs outreach effort through the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments Office of Communications and WABA.
- The design and distribution of free t-shirts by Commuter Connections.
- Donated bicycles for the regional raffle from BicycleSPACE, and Bikes@Vienna as well as Three Points Cycles.


In addition, 19 confirmed bicycling convoy routes were identified by WABA along with route leaders who assisted novice and experienced cyclists through the routes. Each route traveled to a

pit stop where cyclists received free refreshments, t-shirts and other giveaways. Many pit stops had additional activities for bicyclists and are described later in this report.

Since 2000, the COG/TPB's Commuter Connections program has worked to increase awareness of bicycling to work as a viable commute option by joining with the WABA in their efforts to promote and coordinate the region's annual Bike to Work Day event. Commuter Connections created and maintains a regional marketing effort that helped to increase the number of cyclists participating in the yearly event from 1,100 in 2001 to a peak of more than 18,000 in 2017. Although biking to work accounts for a small percentage of the overall regional commute mode split, bicycling helps reduce traffic congestion, improves air quality, and provides a healthy commute alternative for those commuters who choose to use it as a sustainable means of transportation to and from work.

Since 2006, the Bike to Work Day Event has a budget line item for the Commuter Connections Work Program. Commuter Connections is funded by the District of Columbia, Maryland, Virginia, and U.S. Departments of Transportation.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS FROM AREA PIT-STOPS**

**Adams Morgan:** The event was held at Unity Park from 7:30am to 11am. There were 362 registrants for the pit stop.

**Alexandria Carlyle Square:** The event was held at John Carlyle Square Park from 6am to 9am. There were 450 registrants.

**Alexandria:** This year was a transitional year for the City of Alexandria's Bike to Work Day. After a long hiatus due to COVID we finally were back at City Hall's Market Square as the main Bike to Work Day pit stop. This allowed us to host a larger affair than we had in the last couple of years as COVID took us away from larger gatherings. While splitting participants up amongst smaller pit stops sustained us, the City's bike commuters missed the fanfare and camaraderie that Market Square provided.

This year's affair included a set by DJ Regy Reg, A 360 Photobooth experience with your bike, coffee, eats, on site tune-ups and of course tabling by our wonderful City partners, businesses and agency representatives and of course our giveaways and BTWD T-Shirts. We were grateful to finally have enough to not run out this year, although we did have requests for larger sized 4XL and 5XL shirts we could not accommodate. We added to our slate of sponsors this year with prizes, donations and giveaways provided by Wegmans, Athleta, the Water Taxi, ESP Tea and Coffee and so much more.

Despite competing with the opening of the brand-new Potomac Yards Metro Station we were still able to net appearances by several local officials including the Mayor, City Manager and local council members. We had 308 people register online and had more people show up and sign up. Between the 5 pit stops within the City of Alexandria we had over 1,100 registrations. Thanks to a strong push towards then end and a great interview on WUSA we saw another year of increased participation.

**Alexandria Del Ray:** The event was held at Colasanto Park from 6am to 9am. There were 212 registrants for the pit stop.

**Alexandria National Landing at APTA:** The event was held from 3pm to 6pm. There were 45 registrants for the pit stop.

**Anacostia:** The event was held by the Arts Center from 7am to 9 am. There were 51 registrants for the pit stop.

**Anacostia Riverwalk Trail:** The event was held from 7am to 9am. There were 129 registrants.

**Annandale:** The event was held at Wakefield Park/Audrey Moore RECenter from 6:30am to 9am. There were 51 registrants for the pit stop.

**Annandale George Mason Library:** The event was held from 6:30am to 9am. There were 17 registrants.

Arlington Mill: The Arlington Mill pit stop was held on the plaza of the Arlington Mill Community Center from 7-9am. Participation was strong for this first year of the stop with 112 registrants. In addition to claiming their free tee-shirt, riders enjoyed getting free bike safety checks from Phoenix Bikes mechanics, relaxing with chair massages from Elements Massage in Pentagon City, and browsing information from the Animal Welfare League of Arlington and Cyclebar Columbia Pike. Riders enjoyed hot coffee from Commonwealth Joe, delicious donuts from Good Company, cookies from Captain Cookie & the Milkman, and bananas from MOM's Organic Market in Arlington. Raffle prizes and give-aways including gift cards to a new tapas bar on Columbia Pike Sabores, a one-month Cyclebar pass, 60-minute massage from Elements Massage, and free trial passes to VIDA Fitness and Spenga in Ballston.

**Bethesda:** The event was held at the Capitol Cresent trail from 6:30am to 8:30am. There were 448 registrants.

**Bladensburg Waterfront Park:** The event was held at the Waterfront Park from 7am to 9am. There were 83 registrants for the pit stop.

**Briggs Chaney Park & Ride Mobile Commuter Store:** There were 20 registrants for the pit stop.

**Brunswick MARC Station:** The event was held from 9am to 11am. There were 25 registrants for the pit stop.

**Burke:** There were over 50 people who signed up, and over 30 came. There were a couple of "bonuses" supervisor Walkinshaw's chief of staff, Frank Anderson, was a rider. And Lake Braddock Secondary School's Safe Routes to School coordinator held an event early this morning at the school for teachers who bikes (with doughnuts - wheels for wheels) before she biked to the stop and took the VRE downtown for work.

The regional engineer for VRE was there (Dallas Rogers), talking with people about to bring bikes on VRE, and many people who weren't biking came over and took info.

**Capitol Hill Eastern Market:** The event was held at the Eastern Market Metro Plaza from 7am to 9am. There were 382 registrants for the pit stop.

**Capitol Hill at House Office Buildings:** The event was held at South and C Streets SE from 7am to 10am. There were 48 registrants for the pit stop.

**Capitol Riverfront:** The event from 7am to 9am. There were 173 registrants for the pit stop.

**Cathedral Heights:** The event was held from 7am to 9am. There were 126 registrants.

**Centreville/Clifton:** The event was held from 6:30am to 9am. There were 15 registrants for the pit stop.

**Chantilly Library:** The event was held at the Chantilly Regional Library from 6:30am to 9am. There were 43 registrants for the pit stop.

**Chantilly Sully:** The event was held from 6:30 am to 9:30am. There were 16 registrants for the pit stop.

**Coast Guard Headquarters:** The event was held at US Coast Guard Headquarters from 6am to 9am. There were 54 registrants for the pit stop.

**College Park City Hall:** The City of College Park hosted its morning pit stop at City Hall Plaza from 6:30 to 8:30 am. There were 134 registrants.

Columbia Heights Plaza: 125 cyclists enjoyed a bright, sunny, warm May afternoon at the Columbia Heights Plaza in Northwest DC, for the annual "Ride Home from Bike to Work Day '23". We were assisted by 8 loyal volunteers (Debra, Graham, Karen, Laurel (and baby), Max, Nathan, Phoebe, & Sarah), and joined by the "Book Bike" of DC Public Libraries (DCPL), WABA, the DC 3rd District community-service police officers, and the wildly-popular Leah Fantle of UpShiftDC for bike tune-ups. Councilwoman Brianne Nadeau brought her 2 daughters by bike early in the afternoon, and ANC-1A members Jeremy Sherman and Max Ewart (also a volunteer) stopped by later.

300 pre-registered, and 36 registered on-site, supplemented by 2 (the lowest quantity in years!) from previous pit-stops. Giant donated \$50 for food (bananas, apples, mandarins) and water. Plenty of maps (DC, Regional, and Fairfax County) were distributed, and WABA and DCPL signed up a few new members.
