
Food and Agriculture in the Region

How Can Local Leaders Help?

- Use an equity lens
- Support food banks, food pantries, and other food providers with financial contributions, volunteer services.
 - Remember providers serving especially vulnerable populations (i.e. Latinx immigrants)
 - Make other connections to the regional food economy when possible (i.e. farmers, food hubs, restaurants)
- Support advocates for stronger safety net programs (i.e. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – SNAP) and local food policy changes
 - Examples: DC, MD, and VA Hunger Solutions, local food policy councils
- Invest in coordination of food assistance, technical assistance and other services to farmers, food entrepreneurs, etc.
