Priorities

- Providing high quality service to those we come in contact with
- Developing leadership capacity
- Preparing for the initial stage of a response to mass causality event

Concerns

- ARC responder safety
- Coordination with all levels government should a consequence management event occur
- Bad weather

Our Role

- The Red Cross in the National Capital Region is part of the National Special Security Planning Structure, and our role consists of providing “go teams” to help monitor the safety and health needs of participants and connect them with the appropriate first responders.
- We also provide consequence management support should the need arise during large-scale events.
- As a Region, we have served in this capacity for more than 25 years in a non-partisan manner, supporting our Federal and D.C. partners to ensure that event participants remain safe and secure. This included President Obama’s Inauguration, State Funerals, the opening of the MLK Memorial, the 50th Anniversary of the March on Washington and many other events in our Region

Overview

- Planning with our government partners started in the summer
- 200 Responders (100 from out of region)
- Recruitment of volunteers started in late October
- Logistics build up started in early January
- Overall operational period Wed, 1/18 – Sat, 1/21
- Involvement of our Region, 3 surrounding Regions, Mid-Atlantic Division and National Headquarters

Mission: Support DC Government's operation at RFK Stadium/Bus Staging Area

- 5-10 GO Teams at RFK Stadium
- Canteening for support workers
- NCR RDCC activated: 8am -8pm
- 2 EOC's staffed
- Staff shelter closes at 2pm

Consequence Management

- Services expected to support:
 - Shelter at 10 locations
 - Reception sites: 9 at walk-out routes
 - Reunification sites + Safe & Well
 - Incident sites: 4 to support responders
- Pre-positioned 10 shelter trailers on & beyond perimeter
- Rally points & communication protocols established
- On Standby:
 - 3 ERVs, 2 Box Trucks, 2 Critical Incident Trailers, 3 AFN Trailers
 - 50 responders from NCR
 - 30 responders from neighboring regions and 3 ERVs
 - 175 responders from along the East Coast
 - 2 Staff process center/ staff shelter North and south of the District of Columbia
