



Distribution of Federally Owned/Leased Office Space



# Federal Spending in the Region FY2000


Direct Spending \$51 Billion

Generated (Indirect) Spending \$33 Billion


Total Spending \$84 Billion

# Direct/Indirect Federal Procurement Spending Accounts for 21% of the Gross Regional Product




The value of procurement contracts more than doubled in the last 10 years, from \$12.5 billion to \$31 billion










Federal facilities are located to take advantage of existing and future mass transit options

## Federal Capital Improvements Spending



- Advisory authority in the NCR





# **New Security Initiatives**


#### Updated urban design and security plan:
