## Chesapeake Bay Program

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation Gives the Bay a D+ in its Latest Biannual Report Card, which denotes a slight improvement in the Bay's nutrient reductions and dead zone from 2018, due to favorable weather and wastewater treatment plant upgrades. The Report indicates oyster restoration is working, but the score is reduced by striped bass declines. On a positive note, in 2020 the Atlantic Marine Fisheries Commission took stronger actions to protect Striped bass. https://www.cbf.org/about-the-bay/state-of-the-bay-report/
