Montgomery County Bag Law Update Leslie Wilcox Department of Environmental Protection

The Basics

- Passed by council on May 3, 2011 and implemented on January 1, 2012
- Requires all retailers to charge 5 cents for plastic and paper disposable carryout bags
- Paper bag exemption allows restaurants to give out only paper bags for free
- All fees collected from the tax go to the Water Quality Protection Fund




Program Development

- First years of implementation focused on educating businesses about the bag law
- More active outreach program designed to maintain contact with businesses and offer resources for compliance
- Ensure all retail establishments are in compliance with the bag law

Current Outreach

- Contact retail businesses who should be in compliance with the bag law, ensure they are registered
- Offer resources for the store such as flyers, posters, and training resources
- Add business information to database and maintain contact to check in on compliance over time
- Continue general public outreach and follow up on citizen complaints
- Provide reusable bags as giveaways when possible


Reusable bag giveaway

- DEP has ongoing reusable bag giveaways at events and fairs
- Conducted 2 larger reusable bag giveaways
 - One leading up to the law implementation
 - Current bag giveaway
 - Bags available for residents to pick up at all county libraries, 8 HHS benefit locations, and Manna Foods
 - Also giving away bags at events
