Regional Climate Change Report, 2008

•The National Capital Region Climate Change Report adopted by COG Board in November 2008

- Examines potential climate change impacts on our region
- Evaluates mitigation strategies
- The report proposes significant short-term, medium term and long-term greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction goals for the region.
 - 10 percent below business as usual by 2012
 - 20 percent below the 2005 levels by 2020
 - 80 percent below 2005 levels by 2050.



CEEPC Created, 2009

The Climate, Energy and Environment Policy Committee (CEEPC) was created in 2009 by the COG Board of Directors

CEEPC's role:

- Provide leadership on climate change, energy, green building, alternative fuels, solid waste and recycling issues
- Help support area governments as they work together to meet the goals outlined in the National Capital Region Climate Change Report.



CEEPC Created, 2009

CEEPC's planning area includes all 22 COG member local jurisdictions. Charles County, MD is a new member of COG as of January 2012.

CEEPC Action Plan

 In January 2010, CEEPC adopted the 2010-2012 Regional Climate and Energy Action Workplan

• Identifies short term goals and action items to meet the regional GHG emissions reduction goals identified in the *National Capital Region Climate Change Report*.

•CEEPC will be asked to adopt the 2013-2016 Action Plan in March 2013.

 COG staff is also in the process of developing guidance (descriptions, examples, resources) for all 60+ goals identified in the 2013 – 2016 Action Plan.



Tracking CEEPC Action Plan Progress

 Local governments, energy utilities, water utilities, school districts, and cooperative purchasing program participants are surveyed on climate, energy, and sustainability

• Survey results inform the annual Climate and Energy Progress Report.

• First annual progress report was published in 2011



Key Accomplishments

- Over 50 percent of local governments have developed a GHG inventory for government operations
- Over 1,000 grid-connected renewable energy systems are operating in the region
- Over 30 percent of local governments have adopted a green fleet policy
- Over 35 percent of local governments implementing a community energy challenge by 2011.



Key Accomplishments

- Sent 62 local government representatives to the 2010 International Code Council Final Action Hearing to support the adoption of 30 percent more stringent building codes.
- Hosted dozens of special events on greenhouse gas inventories, green building, community energy planning, renewable energy, climate adaptation, and electric vehicles.



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
