



2009-2020: A 61% DECREASE IN HOMELESSNESS



IMPLEMENTATION: SUCCESSES

- Our strategic plan has supported a 61% decrease in homelessness which is by far our greatest success.
- Targeting resources towards vulnerable subpopulations like veterans and the chronically homelessness has allowed us to pivot our focus towards other areas of particular need identified in our plan.
- Arlington and COG's Homeless Services Committee members will be partnering to explore/address **racial equity** as a region.
- **Private-public partnerships** such as the Shared Prosperity Initiative a collaboration of Urban Institute, The Kresge Foundation, Brookings Metropolitan Policy Program, and Living Cities have emerged along with a budding relationship with Amazon.

IMPLEMENTATION: CHALLENGES

- While we have made much traction in the development of affordable housing,
 the existing supply and creation of new stock cannot keep up with the demand
- **Employment** continues to be a challenge due to limited pathways to quality jobs that pay a living wage.
- The **current political climate** has created uncertainty around funding, policy priorities and the future of some of our neighbors who have mixed or no legal status.
- Youth homelessness has proven difficult to quantify which makes the design of solutions a challenge to address.
