

## **Survey Takeaways**

#### What Went Well/What Was Most Relevant in 2024

- "Actionable updates from other local transit agencies whose efforts we could replicate inhouse."
- "I thought some of the insights from other regions was helpful."
- "External transit experts presenting on a topic of interest/relevance from outside the region."
- "I appreciated the examples of new initiatives."
- "I like getting to interact with staff from other agencies and learn about what they're doing."

#### What Could Improve in 2025


- "Starting promptly at 12 pm, regardless of attendance. Virtual only reduces the commute commitment, which can often be a full day for those of us in the outer suburbs."
- "Reduce number of presentations to allow more discussion.
- "Post the agenda and materials online several days before the meeting.
- "Better food for in-person meetings. Designate some meetings as in-person only, versus virtual. Designate at least 2 in-person site visits per year. Include more workshops and round-robins for in-person or virtual meetings mid-way through agenda to keep engagement high."



### **Other Survey Takeaways**

- #1: Regional forum focused on a specific topic
- #2: Field trips within the region
- #3: Regional transit summit with multiple issues discussed

### **Other Survey Takeaways**

#### What specific topics would you like to see covered in 2025?

- "... innovative projects both within and external to the region. It would also be great to hear about congestion reduction impacts of projects and BRT projects."
- "Ridership forecasting post-Covid, how agencies are navigating operating and capital funding challenges."
- "Transit technology (CAD/AVL, mobile ticketing, real time passenger information)"
- "Bus network design and redesigns, fare policies, experiences with planning software like Remix"
- "Bus propulsion other than diesel and BEB Shared Charging"



## Looking Forward to 2025...

- More discussion and interactive programming (ex. Forums and Workshops)
- Goal of two site visits (1 in spring/1 in fall)
- Reaching out to more speakers outside the region
- At least four In-Person meetings including January 28, 2024 at COG) (maybe exclusively in-person?)
