Saving Members Time and Money

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Cooperative Purchasing: How is Value Created

- Consortium Procurements combine the volume of buying to create market response and significant savings.
- Using the COG Rider Clause allows other agencies to ride or "piggyback" on an existing contract saving time.



Collaborating to Save

- Chief Purchasing Officers Committee (CPOC) is made up of purchasing directors from over 20 different COG jurisdictions and 8 Baltimore Metropolitan Council (BMC) members.
- Affiliates like water & sewer authorities, transit authorities, schools, etc. are also included in this partnership.
- The CPOC group meets quarterly to discuss cooperative purchasing opportunities and contracts available to ride.
 - Subcommittees include Public Safety and Environmental who meet semi-annually to bring focus to opportunities in their areas.



Value Added Services

- Weekly Gasoline and Diesel fuel pricing reports
- We provide information on existing contracts that can be ridden to assist members to find opportunities to save the costs of bidding.
- Our vendor registration system has been revamped and provides vendors a chance to find out about solicitations from our members.



Current Cooperative Procurements: Fuel

Gasoline (Montgomery County) and diesel (WMATA) leveraging pricing based on over 40,000,000 gallons per year. Saving over \$13 million dollars each year for the 28 member entities who are participating.

Current Cooperative Procurements

- Personal Protective Equipment (COG) contract is in place for Fire personnel and is being used by 6 member jurisdictions saving over \$130,000 per year.
- Bottled Water this new COG-led contract currently includes four member jurisdictions. In addition, the vendor is set up to provide water on an emergency basis.
- Others Money & time savings can be realized on current contracts for Electricity, Solar Power, Training, Staffing, as well as Paving, Line Painting, Road Salt, Office Supplies, Furniture and Lighting.

EMS Medical Supplies

EMS Medical Supplies (COG) bid out in November and an award expected January 1. We project an initial annual contract value of over \$1 million and savings of 5-7% over current pricing. Volunteer Fire and EMS can ride on this contract.

Upcoming Cooperative Procurements

- Subscriber Radios (COG) regional RFP pending for early 2017.
 This award will be a 10 year life cycle replacement contract. Our buying power (up to 60,0000 units) could result in additional discounts from \$700-1500 per radio resulting in possible \$40-100 million over 10 years.
- Fleets for the Future (COG) offering is pending in the spring of 2017 for alternative fuel vehicles and equipment. We are working to make this an Eastern Seaboard procurement which will increase our buying power.
- **Next GEN 9-1-1** new technology is coming and this will be a region wide procurement effort. The first procurement for this is being led by Fairfax County for the ESInet new communication network.



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
