TPB road pricing study, regional drought watch get attention

Findings from a study on the impacts of introducing tolls, Bus Rapid Transit (BRT), and land use changes throughout the region were presented at the September TPB meeting. The scenarios study was covered by *The Washington Post*, the *Washington Examiner*, WTOP, NBC 4, and Greater Greater Washington, among other outlets. Also, early in September COG declared a drought watch for the region. George Hawkins, Director of D.C. Water, and Tom Bonaquisti, Loudoun County's Water Quality Program Manager, appeared on TBD's "NewsTalk" to discuss water quality in the region and the drought watch. The drought watch was also covered by WTOP, WMAL, WAMU, *The Washington Post*, WUSA 9, the *Washington Examiner*, TBD, the *Frederick News Post*, and Southern Maryland Online, among others.
