**Inside America's Economic Machine**

The United States has the world's largest economy, with a gross domestic product of \$15 trillion, about twice the size of China, the second-largest economy. The U.S. Census Bureau's economic programs, in particular the five-year Economic Census and the Census of Governments, measure the U.S. economy in its many aspects and help the nation keep its economic edge. 
