Background


- Estimated 2 million visitors
- Estimated 10,000 charter buses
- Numerous events across the city over several days

Traffic Environment

- Buses will be parked at various locations in the city
- High pedestrian traffic on Jan. 20th
- Traffic projected to increase significantly starting on weekend prior to event
- Traffic volumes will be heavy until Wednesday, Jan.
 21
- Major Arteries will experience heavy volume, Northbound traffic may experience heaviest volume
- Volume expected to be heavy in morning/evening timeframe from 4am to 12pm and 6pm to 12am

Restrictions

- Road and bridge closures will begin at 12:01am Monday, Jan 20th
- Businesses will be impacted in Wards 1, 2 and 6
- Reduced lane capacities on major truck routes
- Trucks will be encouraged to be out of the city by Sunday January 18th.
- Expansive outreach to advocacy groups (ATA, UMA, ABA)

Impact on deliveries

- Carriers will be dealing with high package volume (backlog)
- Traffic volume will cause issues with on time delivery within District limits
- Expect limited deliveries from midnight Jan.
 18th-noon Jan 21st
- Encouraging no deliveries on January 19th and January 20th

Coping measures(carriers)

- Ensure deliveries are received early by Jan. 18; coordinate with shippers and customers- be aware of backlog volumes
- Shipments may increase days prior event to compensate
- Avoid Capital Beltway, consider alternative routes (19th and 20th)
- Understand employee/driver needs for Monday-Wednesday
- Disseminate information to trucking companies driver base, owner operators
