#### **Current Situation**



- **PWC Juvenile Detention Center (JDC)** 
  - Court-involved youth
  - Judicial decision
  - Average length of stay: 25 days
  - Average population: 45 per day
  - **◆72-beds**
  - **◆ Built in 1972**
  - 642 youth detained in FY16



## **Special Features**



- Only JDC in Virginia with a GED Testing site;15 GED graduates in CY 2015
- Department of Education conducting school inside the facility – PWCS contract
- Community Services Therapist with a permanent office inside the JDC
- Health clinic



#### **DJJ Transformation**



- Department of Juvenile Justice's Corrections facilities have long lengths of stay and the recidivism rate is high.
- Transformation is needed for Virginia's Youth

## Community Placement Programs



- DJJ is partnering with localities to serve juveniles in CPPs housed in JDCs
- Detainees remain in state custody
- Community placement allows for more family involvement and treatment
- One cell block is used for up to eight males between the ages of 16 and 20 years old
- Lengths of stay averaging from 2 to 12 months

#### **CPP Northern Virginia Region**



- 3-year average, 60 juveniles from NOVA have been committed to DJJ, 15% of statewide commitments
- Of the 60, PWC has committed approx. 21 juveniles per year to DJJ
- 36% of the total committed from NOVA

PWC has the highest rate of commitment in NOVA
PWC JDC is a good location for CPP



#### **DJJ Funding**

Covers cost of clothing, food, staffing, programming, education, medical, dental, etc.

If youth has graduated high school, DJJ will cover additional educational expenses such as community college tuition, online courses, and certifications.
