- Invited speakers will provide state legislative and budget updates from Maryland and Virginia.
- The first edition of the Healthy Food Access Policy Compendium for Metropolitan Washington will be released.
- Congressman Jim McGovern's office will provide a short briefing on the White House Conference on Hunger, Nutrition and Health.
- FARM Policy Committee Work Groups will discuss their first meetings and next steps.
- FARM members will be asked to review and approve updates to the Bylaws and the FY23 Work Program.

#### Food Security News and Notes

Federal Public Health Emergency and SNAP Emergency Allotments

- Recently the 60-day deadline to notify states of the end to the federal public health emergency (PHE) passed.
- The federal PHE is expected to be extended into October.
- This has important implications for SNAP Emergency Allotments, Medicaid, and more.
- The District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia have the possibility to continue to request and issue SNAP Emergency Allotments into the fall.

### Pandemic Electronic Benefits Transfer (P-EBT)

The Center for Budget and Policy Priorities has released a new report on the critical importance of P-EBT in combatting summer childhood food insecurity, including how states can submit Summer P-EBT plans.

- Food insecurity is higher in the summer and summer meal distribution will be changing.
- The document includes a state-by-state table of estimated numbers of children impacted last summer, and total estimated funds disbursed.

### **Drinking Water, Water Supply and Drought**

Regional Water Supply and Drought Outlook

The latest U.S. Drought monitor released on April 28 indicates that some areas are abnormally dry mainly due to low streamflow and precipitation levels over the past few months. The areas monitored in the COG region by the Maryland Department of the Environment and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality are under a normal status. Groundwater levels are normal to low, and local reservoirs remain full. Long-term forecasts indicate that we should remain drought free over the next three months.
