Goal Revisions - Increase

- 4. ~~50%~~ **75%** of jurisdictions adopt plans to reduce GHG emissions community-wide.
- 49. ~~50%~~ **75%** of jurisdictions have a green roof located on government property.
- 62. ~~50%~~ **75%** of jurisdictions promote incentives for consumer purchase ENERGY STAR rated appliances.



Goal Revisions – Decrease

- 7. ~~100%~~ 75% of jurisdictions prepare an energy plan for local government facilities.
- 25. ~~100%~~ 75% of jurisdictions become an EPA Green Power Partner.
- 29. ~~100%~~ 75% of jurisdictions offer a government employee commuter options program.



Tracking and Benchmarking

- 5. 100% of jurisdictions track and benchmark energy performance in all government buildings ~~and participate in a regional EPA Portfolio Manager Master Account.~~
- New - 75% of jurisdictions benchmark energy performance in all government buildings.
- New - 75% of jurisdictions participate in a regional EPA Portfolio Manager Master Account.



Detailed Guidance Example

24. 100% of jurisdictions have a renewable energy system on local government property.

- Description: Each jurisdiction owns and operates at least one renewable energy system on local government property. This may include solar, wind, geothermal or hydropower.

Examples for Goal 24

- Fairfax County's Noman M. Cole, Jr. Pollution Control Plant replaced four standard 25 horsepower mixers with a solar mixer that is saving about \$40,000 a year in energy costs.
- The City of Takoma Park has installed 94 kilowatts of solar panels on city facilities, including the community center and public works facility.
