In an August 10, 2021 Federal Register notice the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking comment on a proposal to revise greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions standards for light-duty vehicles for 2023 and later model years to make the standards more stringent, due September 27. A joint letter from the Transportation Planning Board (TPB), the Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee (MWAQC), and the Climate, Energy and Environment Policy Committee (CEEPC) supporting the proposal has been drafted for review and approval. The Steering Committee will be asked to approve this letter.

Action: Approve draft letter.

2. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION TO DESIGNATE CRITICAL URBAN FREIGHT CORRIDORS IN THE VIRGINIA PORTION OF THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION PLANNING AREA

MPOs designate Critical Urban Freight Corridors (CUFCs) and there is an opportunity to provide additional miles to the current Northern Virginia designation. DDOT has requested an amendment to update funding and information for 20 projects in the District's section of the FY 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). These projects are receiving funds from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), which was signed into law on March 11, 2021. All 20 projects have either been included in the Air Quality Conformity Analysis of the 2020 Amendment to Visualize 2045 and the FY 2021-2024 TIP or are exempt from the conformity requirement. The Steering Committee will be asked to review and consider recommending that the TPB approve Resolution R4-2022 at its September 22, 2021 meeting.

Action: Recommend that TPB Approve TPB Resolution R4-2022.
