

# COG's Strategic Plan Brief History

- November, 1999 Board adopts first-ever Board-directed Strategic Plan
- July 2002-2003 Board retreats focus on progress and updates
- July 2004 Board retreat provides detailed feedback to complete 2004 COG Strategic Plan update
- September 2004 Recommended plan updates shared with COG Board





# Recommended Updates to COG's Strategic Plan



### Strategic Plan Streamlined

- COG's updated Strategic Plan will include only Vision, Mission, and Goals
  - Retains much of 1999 plan, plus 2002/2003 retreat recommendations
  - Captures the intrinsic nature of COG.
  - Generally plan will not change from year to year.
- Goals implemented via COG's annual work program strategies and projects.



### July Retreat Feedback

- Concurrence with streamlined plan approach and work plan integration.
- Retention of 1999 phrasing in COG Vision statement.
- Detailed goal review:
  - Enhancements/editorial improvements to transportation, energy, housing, health, communication, advocacy, value-added services, staffing and support goals.



#### COG's Vision

- The elected officials of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) envision the National Capital Region as the best place to live, work, play and learn.
- COG promotes regional partnerships, develops best practices, and applies cutting-edge technologies to facilitate realizing this vision.
- COG fosters regionalism -- proposing and facilitating regional solutions.




#### COG's Mission

#### COG's Goals


- COG's goals are statements of broad policy


