Background	 This workshop is being hosted by the Regional Operations Subcommittee of the Metropolitan Area Transportation Operations Coordination (MATOC) Program. MATOC is an independent program of the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia Departments of Transportation and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority. MATOC is a regional program to enhance the availability of real-time transportation information and strengthening coordination among transportation agencies, including: Improving technological systems for sharing transportation information among agencies involved in managing regional incidents Enhancing the transportation sector's standard operating procedures and notification practices for incidents Providing more timely and accurate transportation information to the public during incidents. The charge of the Regional Operations Subcommittee is to: Develop standard operating procedures that define agency and MATOC responsibilities for sharing information with each other and the public and coordinating response actions in the aftermath of events, incidents, and emergencies that affect the performance of the transportation system in the National Capital Region (NCR). Help define functionality of regional information systems to meet the information and response coordination needs of MATOC and agency operations staffs. Identify staffing requirements and needs, including training needs, essential for carrying out MATOC responsibilities on a 365/24/7 basis.

	 Building upong existing plans, develop regionally coordinated transportation management plans that can be quickly implemented when an incident or emergency occurs on a critical transportation link in the region. Conduct post-incident reviews aimed at identifying ways of improving information sharing tools, standard operating procedures and operations staff performance.
Work Shop Description	Three tabletop exercises will be conducted during the workshop. The meeting facilitator will describe an incident and walk players through a series of events that occur over time in response to the incident. Part way through each exercise, the scenario will be paused so that players can describe gaps and opportunities for communications and information sharing. Participants will be asked not only to participate in the exercises but also to brainstorm ways that communications and information sharing could be improved with MATOC resources.
