

What is a TAP?

The Technical Assistance Panel (TAP) offers technical analysis to communities and organizations facing land-use challenges.

ULI members volunteer their time to provide unbiased, expert advice and specific recommendations for improvement. Local industry leaders draft a plan to revive, rethink, and restore communities to ultimately enact change and improve the lives of people in the DC region.

Day One

- Meetings with sponsor representatives
- Interviews with stakeholders and community representatives

Day Two

- Work session to develop recommendations
- Presentation to sponsor and stakeholders



How does ULI provide this assistance?

A community group or organization approaches ULI with a request.

ULI convenes a group of experts to focus on specific questions in a concentrated, finite effort and communicates the results.

- group of experts = Technical Assistance Panel
- specific questions = defined by the sponsor
- concentrated, finite effort = two intense days
- communicates the results = presentation to the sponsor and published report

The Sponsor pays a fee for service (\$15,000) to ULI Washington. COG contributes an additional \$7,500 toward the project.















Date	Outcome
April 19 - May 31, 2024	Applicants (Sponsors) apply to the program
June 2024	ULI Washington and COG review applications
July 2024	Begin Scoping process
August 2024 – May 2025	ULI Washington conducts 3 TAPs
October 2024 – July 2025	ULI Washington develops and delivers a Report for each TAP
