Initial Funding Priorities

- Education & Youth: Expanding access to childcare for low-income families and services for out of school children and youth.
- Employment and Small Business: Mitigating loss of wages and work for hourly and gig economy workers and small business owners, especially for people of color who are disproportionately affected.
- Medical Care and Access: Supporting health care and direct service providers and expanding medical care access for seniors, marginalized communities, people without coverage, and others.
- Homelessness and Housing: Addressing the unique needs of people experiencing homelessness and people at risk of homelessness.
- General Operating Support: Filling gaps for nonprofits providing critical services while facing loss of revenue or lack of volunteers, supplies, or equipment.
