Shared Riding & MicroTransit




- 1: Expand availability of transportation across the city
- 2: Reduce congestion and emissions
- 3: Improve safety/QA across the VFH spectrum
- 4: Modernize technology infrastructure





- Improve access to transportation in underserved areas
- Studied transportation options in areas with low taxicab use (data and surveys)
- Laid out four routes based on projected ridership, trip purpose, and trip length
- Launched as pilot in FY17, with grants for companies to buy vans and train drivers, plus vouchers to use the service





- Linear and circular routes in Wards 4, 7, and 8
 - Small, comfortable 8-seat Ford Transit vans
- Pickups at fixed locations
- Dropoffs anywhere on route & allowed to turn
- Fare \$3.25
 - Passengers pay cash, payment card, or phone
- High customer satisfaction, mixed route viability





- MicroTransit can solve transportation problems
 Provide better service at lower prices
 - Create new revenue for taxicabs

 Focus routes on ridership and viability
 - Linear routes outperform circular routes

 Include last mile to/from Union Station

FEATURES

- available now
- · gives passengers a new, lower-cost option
- shared ride fare 45% lower (\$1.20 vs. \$2.16/mi)
 - vehicle types includes all taxi sedans
 - opens the road to micro-transit



MicroTransit Expansion



FEATURES 1 of 2

- builds on the Neighborhood Ride Service
 - vehicles expanded to taxi sedans
 - uses the lower, shared ride fares
 - data-optimized routes/marked pickup locations including union station to city center

FEATURES 2 of 2

- New: vehicles expanded to TNCs
 - New: option to hail via app
- New: use of ehail smart buttons
 - New: link to digital signage
- Participants and app by RFP and/or grants
 - Seeking partners now
