1. CALL TO ORDER, INTRODUCTIONS, MEETING SUMMARY APPROVAL AND ANNOUNCEMENTS *Vice Chair, Era Pandya*

The meeting was called to order, introductions were made by members, committee applicants, guests, and COG staff. There were no amendments to the agenda and the November 28, 2022, meeting summary was approved with no amendments.

Tad Aburn inquired about ACPAC's response regarding the District of Columbia's plans to install a bus depot in Cheverly, MD. Mr. offered to bring Cheverly, MD community members and a representative from the University of Maryland environmental justice center to discuss the potential environmental justice issues associated with the project. Leah Boggs responded that the COG Board advised Mr. Aburn to direct his efforts to the District and Prince George's County. ACPAC is addressing environmental justice through updating the 2017 Environmental Justice Toolkit. Member Elizabeth Spike pointed out that Dr. Sacoby Wilson from the University of MD previously presented to the committee.

Announcements

Elizabeth Spike announced that as chair of the K12 education committee for the Air and Waste Management Association, \$15,000 was secured to work with 15 teachers from area schools. The teachers will learn how to set up the AIR Now purple air sensors at high sc. Possibly 6 schools will be part of the program and one Prince George's County applicant has applied. The teachers will have 10 hours of training.

Deborah Shprentz announced that EPA has published for public comment their proposal to strengthen the National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for particulate matter (PM) which hasn't been revised since 2012. They are looking at tightening the range for the average annual standard. The health community has concerns regarding EPA's omission to propose an update of the 24-hour standard for PM 2.5. There is strong support from the health community to strengthen the 24-hour standard.

Peter Mecca expressed appreciation for being able to attend CEEPC's electric vehicle (EV) meeting at the Washington Auto Show. Mr. Mecca is excited about the future of EV deployment in the region.

2. ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE TOOLKIT PROPOSAL UPDATE AND TOOLKIT OUTLINE

COG ACPAC will identify potential topics for the year in the context with other COG committee priorities including the Climate, Energy & Environment Policy Committee (CEEPC), Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee (MWAQC) and the Built Environment and Energy Advisory Committee (BEEAC).

- Public/community outreach and engagement2
