 - Support Policies to Meet the Region's Climate Goals



2019 Important Dates

District of Columbia

- January 8 – First DC Council Legislative Meeting

Maryland

- January 9 – MD General Assembly Convenes
- February 4 – Senate MD Bill Introduction
- February 8 – House MD Bill Introduction
- March 18 – MD Bill Crossover
- April 8 – MD Adjournment “Sine Die”
- April 28 – Final Date to present MD Bills to Governor
- May 28 – Deadline for MD Governor to Sign/Veto Bills

Virginia

- January 9 – VA General Assembly Convenes
- January 18 – All VA bills and joint resolutions filed
- February 6 – VA Bill Crossover
- February 23 – VA Adjournment “Sine Die”
- April 3 – Reconvened VA Session Begins



District of Columbia Legislation

- **B22-0904 – The CleanEnergy DC Omnibus Amendment Act of 2018**
 - Passed in December 2018
 - Increases Renewable Portfolio Standard to 100% by 2032
 - Establishes solar energy standard post 2032
 - Establishes standards for electricity suppliers regarding renewable energy purchases
 - Removes restrictions on energy efficiency measures
 - Expands functions of the Sustainable Energy Trust Fund
 - Establishes an energy performance standard program for buildings at DOEE
 - Authorizes Mayor to commit the District to participation in regional greenhouse gas emission reducing programs
 - Requires DMV to issue regulations tying the vehicle excise tax to fuel efficiency



Expected Maryland Legislation

- **Clean Energy Jobs Act**
 - Similar bill (HB 1453) was withdrawn last year after receiving an unfavorable report from the House Economic Matters Committee
 - New bill would expand Renewable Portfolio Standard to 50% by 2030
- **Community Solar Bill**
- **Expanded Polystyrene Ban**
- **Green Amendment to Constitution**
 - Senate Committee held a hearing regarding an environmental constitutional amendment last year
 - Since then, a new coalition has been advancing this issue
 - Would establish a constitutional right to uncontaminated water and air, and a healthy environment for present and future generations of Marylanders



Expected Virginia Legislation

- **Already a number of bills filed**
- **2 Net Metering Proposals expected to come out of the Rubin Group**
- **2 Solar Bills:**
 1. **Solar Freedom Bill**
 - Removes 1% cap on net metered solar
 - Confirms legality of PPAs for customer-sited solar
 - Allows local governments to install solar facilities of up to 5 MW on government-owned property and use the electricity for nearby government-owned buildings
 2. **Delegate Kathy Tran proposing a similar bill that is narrower in focus – Focused on local government**
- **RGGI revenues bill**
