



495 Express Lanes Northern Extension Project (495 NEXT)

- Approx. \$660 million, 2.5-mile extension of 495 Express Lanes from Dulles Corridor interchange to George Washington Memorial Parkway (GWMP) near the American Legion Bridge
- Public-private partnership project between VDOT and Transurban through 2087
- Express Lanes scheduled to open late 2025
- Project completion in mid-2026









General Purpose and Express Lanes Access
















Environmental and Sustainability Commitments

- Transurban provided \$1.387M to Fairfax County for restoring approximately 3,000 linear feet of Scott's Run
- Stabilize stream banks at two locations along Scott's Run



Fairfax County Park Authority Replacement Land

- Create parking and trail connection to Scott's Run and new bike-pedestrian trail
- VDOT Maintenance Yard with privacy fence next to park







Construction Sequence

- Started construction: March 2022
- Remove noise walls and clear trees to widen Beltway: late 2022-early 2024
- Install drainage, perform earthwork, construct new lanes outside current I-495 alignment: 2023-2024
- Shift traffic to outside lanes to enable construction of inside lanes: late 2024early 2025
- Open Express Lanes: late 2025
- Complete overall project: mid 2026

Bridge Construction

- Replace old bridges with upgraded new bridges featuring wider sidewalks and trail connections
 - Live Oak Drive
 - Georgetown Pike
 - Old Dominion Drive
- Improve existing Lewinsville Road bridge
 - Widen sidewalk
- Install additional ramp and Beltway bridges
 - Two overpasses for George Washington Memorial Parkway to southbound I-495 ramp
 - I-495 bridges over Scott's Run
 - Overpass for I-495 South to Georgetown Pike ramp
 - Two overpasses for Dulles Toll Road to I-495 North ramp
 - Overpass for I-495 North bridge over Dulles Toll Road ramp



Four 100-ton girders were lifted into place for an overpass for the future southbound I-495 to Georgetown Pike ramp (February 2024)

- 2. Enhance worker and public safety
- 3. Provide reliable information about construction zone

Maintenance of Traffic

Traffic Operations and Incident Management Local Network Operations and Traffic Analysis

Mitigation Strategies Implemented at Georgetown Pike

- Monitoring and adjusting traffic signal timing at Georgetown Pike and Balls Hill Road
- Moved stop bar at Georgetown Pike and northbound I-495 ramp
- Repainted cross hatching at Georgetown Pike and Balls Hill Road intersection
- Funding and coordination with Fairfax County Police Department for increased on-site presence
- Supplemental safety service patrol on I-495







Fairfax Connector Runs on 495 Express Lanes

New commuter bus service between Tysons and Bethesda launching this spring

- Route 798 will be operated by Fairfax Connector
- 495 NEXT funded \$5.2M for purchasing buses
- Transurban to provide \$2.2M per year for bus service operations
- Route will run on the 495 Express Lanes and over the American Legion Bridge










Vanpool Incentives

- One time support to vanpool providers
- \$200 incentive per month for 6 months for every new rider
- Implemented by Vanpool Alliance

Carpool Incentives

- Support to new HOV-3 participants
- \$100 after 3 months in addition to Commuter Connections Pool Rewards
- Implemented by Commuter Connections





Bicycle and Pedestrian Trails

Preliminary design coordinated with Fairfax County to advance county bike plan

Trails added along I-495 corridor

- Shared-use path behind the noise wall between Lewinsville Road and Live Oak Drive
- Connection to future crossing at American Legion Bridge to Maryland









VDOT Coordination with Maryland

- VDOT currently focused on signage agreement for Virginia's 495 NEXT project
- Bi-state agreement will define how Virginia's 495 NEXT project and Maryland's American Legion Bridge and I-270 Corridor Program will interface
 - VDOT continues to coordinate and collaborate with Maryland and Fairfax County to ensure best outcome for the public








