Dear Mr. Paylor:

The Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee (MWAQC) urges Ozone Transport Commission to complete new modeling efforts as expeditiously as possible and no later than February 2007 because the region's draft SIP must be completed by early March. As the policy body responsible for air quality planning in the metropolitan Washington, DC-MD-VA region, MWAQC needs the latest, most accurate modeling results in time to adopt any additional measures that might be needed to meet the ozone standard.

MWAQC, a multi-state planning body, has a SIP approval process that may be longer than individual state SIP approval processes. Next year MWAQC must approve a draft SIP for public hearing no later than March 15 so that public hearings can be held, comments received can be addressed, and a final SIP can be approved in late May for the states' submittal to EPA by the June 15, 2007 deadline.

On behalf of MWAQC, thank you for your efforts at coordinating the regional attainment modeling process. We appreciate the Commission's determination to find measures that will improve the air quality for every state and metropolitan area within the OTR. We want to do our part in the metropolitan Washington region to improve air quality for our residents and neighboring states. To do that, we need final attainment modeling results no later than early February.
