HUD recently announced its intention to offer competitive funding for grants to support multi-jurisdictional regional planning efforts that would help integrate housing, transportation, environmental impact, and economic development. HUD has requested comments on how the program should be structured and funded. 		At the May 20, 2009 meeting, the Board was briefed on travel and socio-economic results focused on regional activity centers from the 2007/2008 survey of over 10,000 households in the Washington Metropolitan region. The Board will be briefed on changes in daily travel patterns based on an analysis of the 1994 and 2007/2008 Household Travel Survey data. The analysis examines the demographic, transportation and land use factors that are influencing changes in daily travel by transit, walking and biking, and compares daily travel patterns for households living within regional activity centers with households in other geographic areas.
