Just how prepared are we?

- A fair question, but very difficult to answer objectively with any degree of precision.
- In spite of the challenge, there are many surrogate measures that, taken collectively, can give us some insight into answering this vital question.



Purpose of the NCR HS Dashboard...

- 1. Provide a more informed and objective assessment of the NCR's emergency preparedness status across the full spectrum of capabilities for senior level decision makers.
- 2. Provide a complementary assessment of the NCR initiatives intended to address specific shortcomings or challenges posed by these same capabilities.
- 3. Serve as the key resource to guide and justify DHS UASI grant applications and allocate grant awards.

The TCL Dashboard tracks the condition (rating) of each of 37 Target Capabilities within the NCR using multiple information sources ...

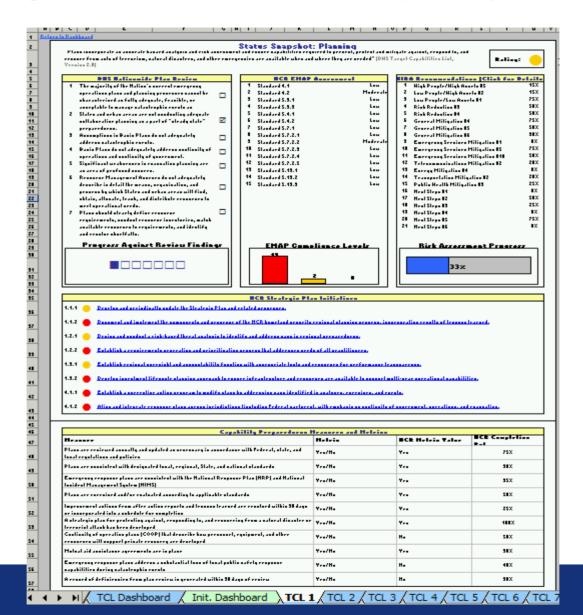
- 1. TCL Preparedness/Performance Metrics--Shows progress against the performance measures and metrics specified by DHS for each capability in the Target Capabilities List, Version 2.0 document. The graphic shows average completion percentage (in green) of performance measures met for each capability.
- 2. NCR Risk Assessment--Displays progress to date against recommendations from the NCR Hazard Identification Risk Assessment (HIRA). The graphic shows average completion percentage of recommendations for each capability.
- 3. NCR EMAP Assessment-- Displays progress against the 58 standards of the Emergency Management Accreditation Program. The red, yellow, and green bars show the relative number of low, moderate, and significant ratings related to each capability.
- 4. Nationwide Plan review-- Displays progress against the 15 "Conclusions for state and local governments" from the 2006 DHS Nationwide Plan Review Phase 2 report. The total number of squares represents the number of findings related to each specific capability, while the number of solid-colored squares shows those that the NCR has completed.
- 5. NCR Strategic Initiatives and their Milestone--Shows total progress to date against each initiative's milestones, and breaks out the progress made since the last update of the Dashboard.

Format of the NCR HS Dashboard...

- The Dashboard is an MS Excel file with multiple worksheets and various formulas, graphs, and links to help navigate through the assessments done in the NCR.
- 2. The worksheets (72 in all) contain detailed snapshots of each of the 37 TCLs and 30 Initiatives followed by the Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA) detail page.
- 3. Other worksheets contain detailed explanations on how to maintain and update these data.

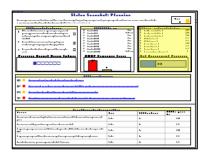

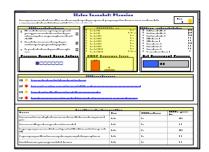
