Item 3. EPA's Reconsidered Ozone Standard

Presenter: Joan Rohlfs, Chief, Air Quality Planning

Description:

On January 19, 2010, EPA published its reconsidered ozone standard in the Federal Register. EPA is proposing a lower range for the new ozone standard and is starting a public comment period. Staff will review the proposed standard and present a draft comment letter for MWAQC's consideration. EPA will hold a public hearing for the proposed rule on February 2 in Arlington, VA.

Description:

Mobile emissions are estimated using a national model approved by EPA. EPA released a new mobile model, MOVES, to replace the current model, MOBILE 6, released in 2004. MOVES estimates multiple pollutants as well as carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases. EPA is requiring the model to be used for SIP emissions inventories for the new ozone SIP and fine particle SIPs.

Staff will discuss the impact of the new model on air quality planning, transportation conformity, and the schedule of transitioning to the new MOVES model.

Item 5. Resolution Authorizing Electronic Meeting in Event of

Emergency

Description:

In November 2009 the COG Board adopted procedures to prepare Continuation of Operation Planning emergency backup plans, COG committees are being asked to review their procedures and make changes necessary to allow operations in the event that a quorum is unable to come to COG for a meeting. MWAQC bylaws require MWAQC to pass a resolution authorizing the use of electronic meeting attendance.

MWAQC Bylaws: 7.5: Alternate Forms of Participation

MWAQC may by resolution provide for meetings to be electronically attended, in whole or in part, either telephonically, by conference call, or by videoconference. If such electronic meetings are held, all participation and voting privileges shall inure to members participating electronically, and all quorum and voting requirements shall include members so participating. Under the direction of MWAQC, or with its consent, any committee or subcommittee may follow this procedure for alternate forms of meetings.

Item 6: Appointments to Air Quality Public Advisory Committee (AQPAC)

Description:
