

National Capital Transportation Planning Board **Enhanced Mobility Grant Solicitation-at-a-Glance** August 28, 2014 to October 17, 2014

#### **Program Background**

The Federal Transit Administration's (FTA's) Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) is a new program created under the MAP-21 Federal surface transportation act in 2013.

The program purpose is to enhance mobility for seniors and persons with disabilities by providing matching grants for programs to serve the special needs of transit-dependent populations beyond traditional public transportation services and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) complementary paratransit services.

## **Funding Amounts and Eligible Recipients**

**\$5.07 million** in federal funds are available for this solicitation; funds must be matched at 20% for capital or mobility management grants<sup>1</sup>, and 50% for operating grants.

**\$2.79 million** (55%) in Federal Funds for Capital grants sponsored by non-profits organization and local governments that meet certain conditions

**\$2.28 million** (45%) in Federal Funds for operating and capital grants; eligible recipients are non-profit organizations, local governments, transit agencies and private providers that meet certain conditions.

The recommended grant application minimum **is \$250,000** (including the match and over a two-year period).

Matching Funds must be clearly identified and secured at the time of application (In-kind contributions **are not an** allowable source of match).

Grant application is for a two-year project.

#### **Project and Geographic Eligibility**

In addition to limiting the types of agencies eligible for Enhanced Mobility funding, Federal rules also limit the types of projects eligible for grant funding and the area to be served. Eligible recipients and activities are outlined in the <u>FTA</u>

<u>Circular</u> (pages III-9 to III-15).<sup>2</sup> Examples of eligible projects include travel training, door-through-door escorted service and sensitivity training.

In order to be eligible for the TPB's Enhanced Mobility funding, **the proposed project or service must end or begin in the** <u>Washington DC-VA-MD Urbanized Area</u> (http://www.mwcog.org/tpbcoordination/resources/geography.asp); the map can be found under "Resources" on the website www.tpbcoordination.org.

# **Priority Projects**

Through a coordinated planning process, twelve Priority Projects for this solicitation have been identified to address significant gaps in transportation for people with disabilities and older adults. The <u>list</u> (http://www.mwcog.org/tpbcoordination/documents/2014docs/2014\_DescriptionofPriorityProjects.pdf) includes travel training, mobility managers and taxi and shuttle services; descriptions can be found under "Resources" on the website. Priority projects are not weighted more heavily than other eligible projects and are subject to the same competitive selection criteria.

# Deadline

Applications must be electronically submitted and are due by **Friday**, **October 17 at 2pm; late** or incomplete applications will not be considered for funding.

# **Competitive Selection Process**

An independent selection committee will make recommendations for funding based on the six selection criteria. The selection criteria are available on the website under "Resources" and include:

- Responsiveness to the four strategies in the TPB's Coordinated Human Service Transportation Plan;
- Demonstration of coordination among agencies and/or jurisdictions; and the
- Institutional capacity of the applicant to manage and administer an FTA grant.
