The **We Are Still In** pledge is an open letter signed multiple types of entities, including universities, businesses, non-profits, and governments declaring that signatories will continue to support climate action to meet the Paris Agreement.

The **Mayor's National Climate Action Agenda** is an organization also known as Climate Mayors, commits members to working together to strengthen local efforts for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and to supporting efforts for binding federal and global-level policymaking.

The **US Climate Alliance** brings states together to reduce emissions 26%-28% from 2005 levels, in order to meet or exceed the targets of the federal Clean Power Plan.
