### Lessons Learned - 2022

- ► Factoring in Lunch break times for Volunteers
- More specific definition of items -
- Clearer about what we accept/what is available for appointment time
- Automated response system
- Small appliance repair fixers
  - ► Not to include electronics
  - ▶ Not to include gas-powered item
- Adjusting time allocation/limit time for repairs
- Fixer stipends

# Event Planning 2023 Fix-it Fair

- Event Planning Team 1 City employee, 4 volunteers
  - Total Six Planning Meetings
- 98% of Appointments booked within 2 weeks (41 out of 42 slots)



5 fix areas: Small Appliances, Lamps, Textiles, Jewelry, PC/Laptop Diagnosis.

Knife Sharpening (CANCELLED)

Event staffing - 1 City employee, 3 volunteers





37 Attendees (34 last year)
41% of attendees were walk-ins/waitlisted

Attendees mostly from Gaithersburg, some from surrounding jurisdictions (Rockville, Montgomery Village, Germantown, Bethesda, Kensington, North Potomac)

Over 98% problem diagnosis 66% successful fixed rate

Harder issues to fix - some electronics, jewelry

Notable fixes include an antique clock, outdoor heating lamp, child car

## 2023 Total Budget

- ► About half the staff time from 2022 event (approximately 45 hours)
- ► About half the cost from 2022 event (\$640)
