Metro Legislation – Virginia

Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Compact of 1966; Metro Reform Commission (HB1539)

- Establishes a dedicated funding source for Metro
- Mandates governance and reform statutes
- Feb 13 Passed House

Commonwealth Transit Capital Bond Act of 2018 (SB856)

- Establishes a dedicated funding source for Metro
- Mandates governance and reform statutes
- Feb 13 Passed Senate

Expected next step: a conference committee to be established to reconcile the two bills. Virginia session ends on March 10, 2018.



Metro Legislation – Maryland

Maryland Metro Funding Act (SB0277/HB0372)

- Establishes a dedicated funding source for Metro
- Feb 13 House Appropriations Committee hearing
- Feb 14 Senate Budget and Taxation Committee Hearing

Maryland Metro Board Member Act (SB0279/HB0370)

- Changes Maryland's board appointees to be the Secretary of Transportation (or designee) and alternating appointment by Governor from Montgomery and Prince Georges counties
- Feb 7 Senate Finance Committee hearing
- Feb 15 House Environment & Transportation Committee hearing

Metro Legislation – District of Columbia

Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Dedicated Funding Act of 2017 (B22-0568)

- Establishes a dedicated funding source for Metro by establishing a 0.75 percent sales tax
- Nov 7 Bill Introduced
- Feb 7 Committee on Finance and Revenue Public Hearing



Metro Legislation – Federal

Metro legislation proposed in the House by:

- Congressman Delaney (Feb 2017)
- Congressmen Brown and Raskin (Nov 2017)
- Congresswoman Comstock (Dec 2017)
- Congressman Connolly (Jan 2018)
