- Danyell Diggs is a senior transportation program analyst with the FTA's Office of Research, Demonstration and Innovation (TRI). The focus of this presentation will be the FTA's 5-year Strategic Transit Automation Research (STAR) Plan. Also highlighted, will be the Integrated Mobility Innovation NOFO that is currently out. Several demonstrations projects related to automation will also be shown.
- 11:30 A.M. 3. FEATURED PRESENTATION: MONTGOMERY CO. FLEX MICROTRANSIT SERVICE**
Deanna Archery, Montgomery Co. Department of Transportation
- Montgomery County Department of Transportation, Ride On will pilot a new microtransit service called FLEX in summer 2019. This service will use small 11 passenger wheelchair accessible vehicles within two designated zones. These zones include Rockville, Glenmont and Wheaton areas. To access the service, users would download an app using a smartphone to request a trip from designated locations within each zone. The virtual stops within the zones will be identified on the app and estimated pick up times will be provided at the completion of the booking process. The current fare will apply to this service as well as all other forms of fare media in the Ride On system. The span of service could vary depending on the zone during this testing phase. The primary destination within each zone will be the Rockville, Glenmont and Wheaton Metrorail Stations; however, stops will be allowed at other locations within each respective zone.

The Abilities-Ride program – offered for trips that begin or end in Maryland since a pilot program was launched last September – provides a more flexible alternative to MetroAccess by allowing eligible customers to use on-demand taxi services at a discounted rate, without having to share a ride.
